YOUNG COUNTERFEITERS CAUGHT WITH EQUIPMENT

Pair of Youths Evidently Conducted Business of "Showing the Queer" With Cleaning and Dyeing Establishment as Blind

PORTLAND, Dec. 29.—Quantities of metal, several partially completed coins, dimes, charcoal, bellows and other paraphernalia used in counterfeiting were seized by Patrolmen Wise, Gill and Burri, at 229 Fifth street, when they took Herbert Yost, aged 18, and Russell Weatherby, aged 17, into custody on charge of counterfeiting and turned them over to the federal authorities.

The police think that, under guise of having a cleaning and dyeing establishment, the youths contemplated conducting a counterfeiting plant of large proportions. It is believed that a third member of the gang, Arthur Rief, has escaped to Seattle with a quantity of worthless coin, which he will put into circulation in not apprehended by the Northern authorities, who have been informed of his probable presence.

That Weatherby and Yost are members of the Duffy-Began gang of counterfeiters is the belief of the police, and Yost made several remarks about Duffy last night after he had been arrested. Mike Regan, one of the noted gang, is thought to be at large in California, while Duffy is serving a five-year term at McNeill's Island for counterfeiting. Rief is also a "pupil" of Duffy, it is said, although the youths under arrest claim that he was only a prospective purchaser.

A quantity of partially completed coins was seized as evidence. They are of quarter-dollar, half-dollar and dollar denominations and all are very defective. It is thought they are waste coins, spooled in the moulding. Piaster of Paris dies were used, and a number were taken by the police, as well as a quantity of the raw material.

No effort was made by the youths to work up any gold material, silver and smelting metals for silver being all that was found.

Weatherby gave his occupation as a messenger when booked at headquarters, but Yost refused to name any occupation.

SEMI-TROPICAL CLIMATE GETS STAGGERING BLAST

Mercury in Heart of California's Famous Orange Belt Drops to 25 Degrees Above Zero, Damaging Crops, Despite Smudging
