MAKE POOR FARMS MODELS

MAKE the county poor farms the model farms of every county where the lessons of good seed, good fertilizing and good methods shall be taught," this is the slogan soon to be propagated by a committee seeking a practical plan of soil conservation and general agricultural education.

The need for some nation-wide, political method of arousing farmers to the immediate profit of building up instead of depleting their farms is being urged upon the nation by the speech of James J. Hill at the opening of the great trial show in Chicago recently.

"If American resources are to be

conserved the farmer must be educated on his own ground and in a practical way," said Mr. Hill.

"Presently all of the so-called expert agricultural information on farming disseminated by our colleges of today is too technical to be understood by the farmer. It goes over his head."

If the farmer is to understand the value of the soil and how to increase its fertility, he will have to be met on his land and shown how to do it there. He doesn't pay any attention to present methods for conserving the soil. He is going about in the same way that farmers have gone through all the centuries. The same thing was done years ago in Norway and in Italy, Spain, at a time in the world's history when they produced 12,000,000 bushels of wheat and now produce only 1,000,000.

The farmer worked as well as he could without thought of fertilization."

Kept Busy
