**TOBACCO BY IRRIGATION
 IS PLAN CUBA PROPOSES**

Law Drafted for Submission to Cuban
 Congress Which Would Give Half
 Million Annually to Be Expended
 on Scheme in Pinar del Rio

HAVANA, Jan. 10.—A law has been
 drafted for submission to the Cuban
 congress to provide for an appropriate
 appropriation of \$500,000 annually for a term
 of four years, to be invested in the
 installation of a number of small irri-
 gation plants in the tobacco district
 of Pinar del Rio. It is expected that
 this sum will annually provide for the
 establishment of from 200 to 250
 small pumping plants and distributing
 services.

This section produces the highest
 grade of cigar tobacco known to the
 trade, and is famous the world over as
 the "Vuelta Abajo."

These plants will be planned to sup-
 ply the "vegas," as the small tobacco
 farms are called, and where it is con-
 venient to do so a number of these
 "vegas" will be grouped and served
 by one plant. The water supply will
 be obtained from a series of wells and
 from small streams. The actual cost
 of the small plants to be put in on
 the vegas is to be repaid in nine an-
 nual payments, beginning in the sec-
 ond year after the installation of the
 plants, by the "vegueros," or tobacco
 planters.

The state will charge no interest on
 the amount invested, and as this fund
 is repaid it will again be invested in
 similar works. This system of irri-
 gation is to be employed in the vicin-
 ity of the towns of Pinar del Rio, San
 Luis and San Juan, where the nature
 of the land and the absence of a fixed
 supply of water in the rivers during
 the dry season makes a larger irri-
 gation system impracticable.

President Gomez and Secretary
 Emilio del Junco, of the agricultural
 department, are working with inter-
 est to give the tobacco growers the
 benefits of irrigation. As soon as it
 is possible it is planned to extend the
 service to other sections of the island,
 so that all the agricultural districts
 will be materially assisted. As Cuba
 is primarily an agricultural country
 the benefits of this work cannot be
 over-estimated. In the Remates dis-
 trict, which is farther west, a large
 distributing system is to be construct-
 ed, which will supply an area of about
 25,000 acres with water.

An international commission is now
 making the preliminary investigation
 having begun its labors last August.
 At the request of the Cuban govern-
 ment the United States reclamation
 service recommended D. C. Henny, an
 engineer long connected with that ser-
 vice and widely known in the irri-
 gation world, and the British govern-
 ment recommended G. H. Wigham,
 who has had years of practical ex-
 perience in Egyptian irrigation.

These two gentlemen, together with
 Eduardo Giborga, professor of hy-
 draulics and mechanics in the Univer-
 sity of Havana, a graduate of Lehigh
 University (1895), were, upon the
 recommendation of Secretary Emilio
 del Junco of Agriculture, Commerce
 and Labor, appointed by President
 Gomez as a commission to make the
 basic studies for Cuba's irrigation sys-
 tem, and it was upon the recommen-
 dation made by Messrs. Henny and
 Giborga that the law is to be passed
 to provide for the small irrigation
 plants first mentioned.
