GOOD COW'S MARK TOLD BY EXPERT FROM MISSOURI

If Body Grows Strongly to Shoulders and Builds Up Much Flesh There She Will Cause Butcher to Rejoice and Dairyman to Lament. "How do you know a good cow?" asked O. C. Gregg of Lynd, Mo., lecturer on the University of Idaho demonstration train, during his talk at Lewiston on Tuesday, January 9th. "The cows we have on this train are full bodied," said Mr. Gregg, "but I am going to confine my remarks entirely to the grade cow. It is not a question so much of breed as it is of the individual cow in that breed. How does she measure up on the points essential for a good dairy cow? I have my way of judging, and I have adopted this way as a result of long practical experience in dairying. "In the first place a good dairy cow must have capacity between her front and her hind legs. If I discover that she lacks in this I never look at her a second time. She must have a big body in order to receive and digest the food sufficient to make good blood and good milk. There must be room for lung expansion and heart action, and this can only be obtained in a big body between the points mentioned. Her next essential point in importance is the region behind the shoulders. There must be scantiness of flesh on the top of the shoulders. If the body of this animal grows strongly to shoulders and builds up a large volume of flesh at this point, the animal is of a character to make the butcher happy and the dairyman sad. If she is big in front she will necessarily be slack in the rear. The third essential is udder capacity, and by udder capacity I do not mean necessarily a large show of udder below the body. I refer to the line of attachment, or the clasping form of udder, which runs from a point a few inches below the tail of the animal to a point very near the middle of her abdomen. Given a large capacity in this respect the animal is fitted for the secretion and production of large quantities of milk. The fourth requirement is the well holes, which have been mistakenly referred to oftentimes as the 'milk veins,' but which are in reality the blood conductors. No attention need be paid to the size of these veins. Speaking from the stand point of the Methodist, I may say that the well holes in a good dairy cow are the 'outward signs of an inward grace.' "A large, full eye in a dairy cow indicates a strong nervous system, which is an essential characteristic of a first class animal. If I were to impress one statement more than another upon the men and women of this state, I would say 'get higher types of dairy sires.' In America we lay great stress on the producing of blooded dogs but have been sadly neglectful of our dairy herds. We seem to be long on dogs and short on cows."

DEMAND FINNISH HORSES FOR RUSIAN ARMY FORCE

Finns Want Home Diet to Exercise Right to Handle Question, But Russian Senate Acts on It With Ominous Decision. United Press Service HELSINKI, Finland, Jan. 16.—Public indignation is running high today against the latest edict of the St. Petersburg government. This is to the effect that Russia, regardless of any action the Finnish diet may take on the subject, shall receive from Finland contributions of horses and transports for the Russian army. While the Finns generally approve of contributing to the empire's defense, they insist on the diet's constitutional right to handle the question. Meanwhile the Russianized senate has decided that Finnish officials who refuse to carry out the new regulation shall be tried in Russian courts, where their conviction would be assured.
