MODEL FARM NEAR BURNS

In Four Months 200 Acres Have Been Cleared, Most of This Plowed, and

Special to The Herald

CORVALLIS, Jan. 16 .- Great progess in the working out of the plans of the branch experiment station of he Oregon Agricultural college in Harney county, five miles from Burns, s reported by Superintendent Leroy Breithaupt, who is in consultation with Director James Withycombe and Professor H. D. Scudder, and will spend several weeks with them, outlining the demonstration and experinent work to be conducted this year. Professor Scudder considers that area resenting the most difficult probems in dry farming of any in the inited States yet developed for this our, ose, but he believes that persistthee and good methods will result in successful production of crops.

When Mr. Breithaupt took the areristendency in September the farm as nothing but an arid stretch of theolately dry virgin soil, with nothing but sage brush on it. In the past four months the whole 200 acres has been cleared of brush and 120 acres plowed. An excellent flow of water was found at a depth of 100 feet and a well sunk. The barn, machine shed, combination cellar-wood house. pump house, teamster's cottage and a superintendent's residence have thirty dozen. been built, and the farmstead laid out with a view to both convenience and attractiveness. The teamster's cottage is a model for the farmer who is just beginning, and cannot afford an expensive structure, while the super intendent's residence is a model for the man who has made his farm successful. The other buildings are also models of their kind.

Fences, gates, roads walks and lawns will be put in during the winter and early spring, and a thoroughly cultivated fallow will be given the entire farm this first year, to conserve duced in 1913. Some crops may be sown this spring, to prove that they cannot be grown successfully the first year on virgin soil in that district.

lences, to demonstrate that farming in a dry region is not necessarily so full of discomforts, and that the BEING RAPIDLY COMPLETED house may be as convenient and attractive as one in the city. Both hot and cold water will be piped through the house, which will have a bath room and inside tollet, and a lawn hydrant for watering purposes and a Number of Substantial Buildings barn faucet will also be piped from the well, which will have the pumping done by a gasoline engine. The same engine will operate a small dynamo for lighting all the buildings by electricity at small cost. Utility, convenence and economy as well as attractve appearance and the health of the residents have been considered in planning the barn the two houses

and all the buildings. "Mr. Brithaupt has handled the work at the station very successfully so far," says Professor Scudder, "and he is imbued with enthusiasm and determination for the future. It is recognized by the authorities here hat there are many extremely difficult problems to solve in the Harney district before dry farming can be made the greatest success. I regard the Harney area as presenting the most difficult problems in dry farming of any area in the United States yet developed for this purpose, but believe good methods and persistence will bring successful production."
