### DE VINCI IVORY CRUCIFIX DRAWS VERY LARG OFFER

### RUSSIA WOMEN LAWYERS MAY SOON BE ADMITTED

To Practice in Czar's Empire, on Recommendation Made to Duma by Commission of Tribunal Reforms, Which Wants Higher Bar Standard

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 17.—Women lawyers will soon be admitted to practice in the courts of Russia, if the recommendation of the commission of tribunal reforms is accepted by the duma.

The report of the commission, adopted by a large majority of its membership, gives the following reasons for its action: "Needs of the general public, which has complained of a dearth of legal advisers; raising of the general standard of membership at the bar by the introduction of the feminine element; proven fallacy of the idea that women are incapable of performing the professional duties of barristers, etc."
