NAYLAN GIVES STONE LIE

ROOSEVELT BOOSTERS'
NATIONAL MEET COMING

Colonel's Committee Has Been In-
structed by Wolverine Executive to
Issue Call for Conference to be
Held Next Month

CHICAGO, Jan. 30.—A national
conference of Rooseveltians probably
will be called to meet here February
6th. Secretary Edwin M. Sims of the
national Roosevelt committee has
been instructed to call such a confer-
ence by Governor C. S. Osborn of
Michigan, who came here to consult
with the committee regarding the
Roosevelt activity in Michigan.

Telegraphic requests to all Repub-
lican governors have been sent out by
the committee, asking them to be
present at the conferences and invi-
tations to participate are being sent
to others interested in the movement.

"We already have assurance that
this national conference will be one of
the greatest and most unique politi-
cal gatherings in the history of the
country," said Sims. "It is probable
that a permanent Roosevelt organiza-
tion will be formed that will devise
ways and means for carrying into ef-
fect the Roosevelt sentiment that is
developing in every section of the
country."

WANTS POLO MAN TO PAY
HER MONTHLY COURT AWARD

Divorced Wife of Wealthy Sport Says
He Has Notified Her That He Will
No Longer Separate Himself From
Support Money

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 30.—Mrs.
