HOW TO BATHE AND SLEEP
TOLD BY DEAN OF WOMEN

Must Not Take Plunges Too Cold,
 While Hot Bath Is Good for Nervous
 Exhaustion—Keep Thoughts
 Good on Going to Bed

CORVALLIS, Feb. 2.—Take care
 of the body, especially in regard to
 baths, sleep and the proper treatment
 of the feet, hair, eyes, stomach, nose,
 throat and teeth, was the subject of
 the address by Dr. Anna Z. Crayne,
 dean of women, before the women of
 the short course at the Oregon Agri-
 cultural college, in which she gave
 them some excellent advice.

"Although some people can stand a
 plunge in ice water, it is apt to pre-
 vent the desired results with most
 people, if they are suddenly subjected
 to cold water," said Mrs. Crayne.
 "The water should be cooled gradu-
 ally, and the temperature suited to each
 person's reaction power. Most au-
 thorities claim it is not right to take
 an absolutely cold bath.

"Do not be too severe with yourself,
 but get the bath habit at all events.
 Hot baths have just a contrary effect
 to the cold; at first the blood vessels
 contract, and then become greatly di-
 lated, the skin gets full of blood, the
 heart beats faster, and the sweat
 glands begin to work vigorously.
 The special use of the hot bath is to
 draw away the blood from some con-
 gested part, or to relax the tension of
 the system. A man sometimes finds
 it impossible to rest because of nerv-
 ous exhaustion. In such a case a hot
 bath is excellent.

"What is it in us that goes to sleep?
 Is it the brain? Certainly it is not
 the body, for the body keeps working
 incessantly. Its activity is simply
 reduced to a lower level. The heart
 beats more slowly, the blood pressure
 is lower, the breathing is irregular
 and less frequent, the muscles relaxed,
 the blood supplied to the brain is
 diminished; but there is still work
 being done. Sleep is a nearly relative
 condition, not sharply cut off from
 waking life.

"The moment of all moments when
 we are most susceptible to psychic
 suggestion is that when we are on the
 verge of sleep. Make sure that the
 thoughts admitted to your mind at
 that time are strong and healthy ones
 —thoughts of joy, of success and ac-
 complishment. It has been proven
 beyond a doubt that a man can make
 suggestions to himself at this time
 with a positive effect for good upon
 the spirit and efficiency of his life.

"As a general principle it must be
 remembered that sleep is a non-stren-
 uous thing. It must not be approach-
 ed like an enemy to be conquered, but
 as a mistress to be wooed, not by di-
 rect attack, but by indirect methods.
 To let down the tension of the day,
 to become quiet in body and mind, is
 the first essential step. Dr. Morse says
 that one of the next great steps for-
 ward will be the gradual acquisition
 of sleep control, so that a man can
 take a few minutes' rest whenever he
 wants it through the day."

FOREST FIRE FIGHTERS GET
NO MONEY FROM NATION

Men Blinded and Disabled in Saving
 Government Trees Subjects of Re-
 lief Efforts Begun by Senator Dixon
 of Montana

 WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 2.—
 Forest service men who are blinded
 or otherwise disabled and the depend-
 ents of men killed in fighting forest
 fires, can expect no compensation
 from the government. To remedy
 this condition Senator Dixon, repub-
 lican from Montana, is making a stud-
 y effort to have the forest service
 employees included in the law which
 awards compensation to victims of
 hazardous government employment.
 The law, with proposed amendments
 in behalf of employees of the bureau
 of mines and the forest service, is
 pending in the senate.

Speaking of the widespread fires of
 1910, Senator Dixon said:
 "I was in the very center of the
 great forest fire of the Northwest
 during that period, and there were
 over seventy-five men burned to
 death in a radius of 150 miles of the
 place where Senator Heyburn and
 myself reside. In the forest ranger
 service during these fires, as I recall
 it, six or seven of the forest rangers in
 the discharge of their duty fighting
 fierce forest fires, were burned to
 death. I know individually of three
 or four cases where the eyesight of
 those men were destroyed, and they
 are blind for life.

"I remember in particular an old
 man who lives at the southern end of
 Bitterfoot Valley, who three years
 ago in the forest fires had his eyes
 completely burned out. His compan-
 ions rescued him, and he is living
 there on the charity of his neighbors
 in the county.

"When those great crises occur and
 men take their lives in their hands
 and go into the mountains fighting
 fire, certainly this government should
 not refuse them the slight pittance of
 six months' pay for disability or one
 year's pay in case of death."
