Employ Large Number of Europeans and Americans Armed With Cartridges to Protect Vaults in Which Are Stored Money and Securities

**HOMESTEADERS HARD HIT
 BY WASHINGTON RULING**

Men and Women Waiting in Line Are Pained to Learn That Initial Payments Will Be Over Twice as Much as They Had Calculated

NORTH YAKIMA Wash., Feb. 6.—The men and women who have been waiting in line before the land office for over a month had a hard jolt dealt out to them when a dispatch from Washington was received saying that holders of preference rights on homesteads under the Tieton third unit would be required to pay building charges of \$1.50 per acre.

In the case of 40 acre tracts, the initial payment, including maintenance charges, would therefore be \$1,175, whereas the homesteaders were expected to be required to meet the one-tenth, or to pay a little more than \$400. Of the ten holders of preference rights four are women—Mrs. Ray Colton, Miss Idella Hasket, Grace D. Smith and Lucetta E. Moore.

**McNAMARAS JUDGE TAKES
 STAND IN DARROW CASE**

Jurist Walter Bordwell Consulted With Jurors in Dynamiting Case and Lawyer's Counsel Wants to Know About Results.

 LOS ANGELES, Feb. 6.—Judge Walter P. Bordwell, who occupied the bench during the McNamara trial, will be called as a witness in the trial of Attorney Clarence Darrow for bribery. This was admitted today by Earl Rogers, counsel for Darrow.

Rogers said that Judge Bordwell, during the McNamara trial, had several conferences with jurors in his chambers, among these being Juror Robert F. Bain, who was mentioned in a Darrow indictment. The defense wishes to know whether Judge Bordwell gained any knowledge regarding jury fixing, and whether the district attorney laid the facts he is said to have learned before the court at that time.

There was much discussion regarding the judge to whom Presiding Judge Hutton will assign the Darrow case. It is possible that Judge Hutton himself will preside.
