ARIZONANS AGHAST AT GOVERNOR-ELECT'S TASTE

Announces Determination to Do Away With Formal Incidents of Inauguration, Such as Parade, and Lovers of Show Are Upset

PHOENIX, Ariz., Feb. 13.—The devotion of Governor-elect George W. P. Hunt to things Jeffersonian, and particularly to the "simplicity" for which the patron saint of Democrats was noted, has caused a conflict between Arizona's first state governor and the various Phoenix committees delegated to arrange for the statehood celebration and inauguration festivities.

Hunt soon after his election announced that his inauguration would be marked by "Jeffersonian simplicity"—that he would walk to the capitol, take the oath of office, deliver his inaugural address and assume charge of the state government.

Notwithstanding this announcement, committees were named and plans made for a big celebration, including a great civic and military parade.

They came word from Globe that the governor-elect had disapproved the programme and reiterated more emphatically his stand against ostentation at the inauguration. He refused to allow the militia to parade, and the plans of the chairman of the parade committee were shattered because the governor refused to ride to the capitol.

A concerted effort will be made to get Governor Hunt to recede from his determination not to allow his introduction into office to be accompanied by festivities upon which the state capital has set its heart.

ALLEGED "QUEER" SHOVER FREED BY FEDERAL JURY

Says Bum Coins Were Palm'd Off on Him by Another, and His Poor Eyesight Failed to Detect Fraud. Other Accused Him of Being Pal.

SPOKANE, Feb. 13.—After giving a detailed account of how he had been enticed into a counterfeiting den in Peaceful Valley by Harry Adams, now serving a term of eight years in the Federal penitentiary at McNeil's Island, Louis Barlow was freed by a jury in the United States court of the charge of passing counterfeit coins. Barlow told how he left his home in Grand Folks, N. D., two years ago, drifted to Spokane, and said that the coins he tried to pass had been given to him by Adams, and that on account of his poor eyesight he failed to detect the fraud. Adams recently pleaded guilty and said that Barlow was a partner.

"ROYAL BEAUTY" EXPERTS IN TOILS FOR DEFRAUDING

Alleged Count and Countess With Bountiful Police Record, Pinched in Colorado for Collecting Money for Fixing Looks' Then Skipping

PORTLAND, Feb. 13.—"Count and Countess" Viggo von Holstein Rathlou, who have a long police record in Portland, are under arrest in Colorado Springs, Colo., on a charge of obtaining money and goods by false pretenses. They operated a "beauty parlor" there long enough to secure many advance subscriptions, and then they decamped. They also are charged with securing goods from merchants on approval and carrying them away at the time of their flight. They were traced by the police to various cities and were finally arrested in Ogden, Utah.

They operated in a similar manner in Portland in November, 1910, going from here to Seattle, after collecting as much as possible from merchants and "beauty treatment" patrons. They were arrested and brought back, and after entering pleas of guilty were paroled. They lived in a small cabin on the East Side for some time, but later disappeared.

Rathlou is a son of Baron von Holstein Rathlou, Odded, Denmark, but was cast off by his family. His wife received great notoriety at the time Dr. Roy A. Miles Collins was shot and killed by Mrs. Kate Collins in their home on Flanders street, in 1909. Mrs. Rathlou was married to Collins when she was a chorus girl in Des Moines, Iowa, and came to Portland with him. In 1908 she eloped with Rathlou, going with him to his father's estate near Copenhagen, where he was repudiated. Later they returned to Portland. In the meantime Collins had been divorced, and had remarried, his second wife being much older than himself. It is said the reappearance of "Countess" Rathlou in Portland aroused the second Mrs. Collins to jealous madness that resulted in the killing. She later was declared insane.
