SPADE IS SPADE WHEN VIA SARDOU

BILL PRESENTED BY DRAMATIC COMPANY SHOWS THAT "DIVORCONS" IS RATHER AN ALLURING BOOK

"Divorcons" proved an alluring trip for theatergoers last night when given at Houston's temple of Thespia on Main street, a short distance west of Second street, on the south side of the street. The word divorce is always fraught with more or less meaning of more or less interesting kind, and the way a number of things were spoken of, especially in the first act, left very little to the imagination. It appeared from the book in this part of the play, especially, that Mr. Victorien Sardou, was a Frenchman who, when dealing in hardware, believed in calling it by its proper name, for there was little chance to cavil at him for misnaming a spade. It was usually called just that—a spade.

But it proved a very interesting story, despite the slight hurdles that the lines proved to be for the members of the company at times. It seems to be rather a coincidence that the names of the people for whom the divorce was most discussed was Prunelles, and that Prunella is a latter day patent compound, like the play, somewhat julep. But the word prunella without a capital letter, means something less pleasant, being nothing other than angina pectoris, which is a contraction of the lower part of the chest. But where are we? Was this to be a dissertation leading up to materia medica? Bless you, no. It started out to be a theatrical review and got sidetracked on prunes, beg pardon—prunellas.

The big prune—if the word may be used—in the cast was Mrs. de Prunelles, wife of Henri, and she thought she wanted to get a divorce to become the bride of Ademar Gratine, a "siss" of a young man. But when she found out how good her husband was to her she changed her mind. Miss Bertha Poltz took the part of the wife of Prunelles with a scope which showed a many-sided, contrary, but withal, affectionate nature. Mr. Newman was rather a stilted husband for the most part, although he bent enough to spend about \$5,000 a year on the

wife—in stage money. J. D. Phipps' idea of the character of the lover, Gratine, was laughable, but hardly as tempered a characterization as might be desired. Miss Lewis, cast as Mlle. de Lusignan, looked a very winsome French maiden, while Miss Bates as Madame de Brionne, was a fashion type. Be it said the three mentioned women in their appearance in the first act showed glowing of a calibre decidedly attractive. Miss Howard as Josephine, the housemaid, showed an intelligence in her work that is apparent in all she does; Ernest Winters had a pair of small appearances, and the effort of Chester Stevens, as the waiter Joseph, was the best character bit that the company has yet shown. This actor was also cast for Bastien, society husband, anxious for a divorce.

BOOSTER ANNEX IN OTHER KLAMATH TOWNS

COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT SWAN AND SECRETARY OLIVER JOURNEY TO OUTSIDE BURGHS TO URGE UPLIFT MOVEMENT

Two of Klamath's boosters, J. G. Swan and C. T. Oliver, will journey to Oline and Bonanza schools today for the express purpose of furthering the development of the booster idea which is so predominant at present in this city. Their purpose will be to still move vividly the idea that the farm is and has always been the seat of industrial development to the country. It is expected that some of the young boosters of this city will accompany them, and there is no doubt but that it will add materially to the encouragement of the movement.

Some few weeks ago Mr. Oliver again took up the movement of gathering together the young men of the city for the promoting of the booster idea, and the result was that the Booster Club was reorganized and new officers elected. At the same time a suggestion was made that if a number of the boosters were willing to accompany the secretary and other boosters of the city, provisions would be made by the Chamber of Commerce for them to do so. Consequently the young boosters became very enthusiastic over the idea.
