HOW TO BUILD UP YOUR HOME TOWN

By Chas. K. Holmberg Civic Betterment a National Problem

Thirty years ago there were only ten "great cities" in the United States with a population of over 100,000 each. The last census shows forty-eight cities of over 100,000, eight of which have over 500,000 and three over 1,000,000 each. With this rapid increase in our urban population over that of our rural, the problem of the city has become a great national question. For this reason social, moral, economic, industrial and political problems confront the whole country and demand earnest attention and press for early and wise solution. The growing tendency of the people to flock to the large cities has resulted in the congestion of population, creating conditions not only undesirable at present, but dangerous to the future welfare of the nation and a menace to the permanency of our cherished democratic institutions. This overcrowding has led to many abuses of the power entrusted to the city authorities and curtailment or loss of the rights of the masses of citizens. Many of the political evils of today are directly traceable to the congestion of population in our large cities, and these evils cannot be cured until the conditions that have produced them are removed.

In recent years there has been a growing, wide-spread sentiment for civic betterment—a most hopeful and encouraging sign of an awakening to improve the condition of our urban population. This awakening has called forth new ideals and advanced ideas with reference to the upbuilding of the small cities and the so-called "country towns."

Today the problem of "how to build up your home town" is, not merely how to add to the population, but how can you make it better, cleaner, more healthy, and more attractive—in all, a more desirable place in which to live? Solve this problem and you have laid the foundation for its substantial upbuilding, and the question of growth and population will take care of itself. When you have made life in the small city or "country town" so agreeable and satisfactory that nobody will want to go to the large city to live, the "lure of the big city" has lost its charm for the growing generation, and population, business and industry will be attracted to the smaller towns, instead of, as in the past, to the already over-crowded cities.

The first step to be taken in the up-

building of the home town is to arouse the public spirit, which may for various reasons have become dormant, inactive or indifferent. Many a town with great natural resources and splendid opportunities for development has "gone to seed" because of a lack of public spirit. And again, cities have been built where the location was unattractive and conditions appeared adverse, because men with broad public spirit, coupled with vim and enthusiasm, were "boasting" to make the town the best in the land from every point of view.

If civic pride is lacking, this must be awakened. If conditions have become such that a general improvement of the town should receive firm consideration, an organization for that purpose may be effected by those who are awake to such a need. If the social and home life of your town has grown dull and cold, some public spirited woman may be found to take matters in hand to bring social sunshine and a genial, neighborly atmosphere throughout the community. If the business interests are lagging and the natural tributary trade is slipping away and going to the mall order concerns of the large cities, the wide-awake merchants should get busy and systematically fight to retain their business and educate the people to see the injury that is done to the home town and its surrounding country when local consumers send their money away from home. If public improvements are needed, those large property owners who appreciate the value of such improvements must lead in the inauguration of the work.

There must be co-operation and unity of action on the part of all citizens, and for this purpose organization, it is of vital importance that men with a spirit of vim and push are placed at the head. Any organized movement for the upbuilding of the home town should have the elements of enthusiasm, aggressiveness and persistency, and its aims and purposes must be definite and fully planned and outlined.

Then to work! Like a well-equipped army, with alert officers, the movement goes on and those things most needful to the community must sooner or later be realized. With an era of improvement and progress inaugurated, the betterment of civic conditions and the upbuilding of the town must go right on, and its future prosperity will be assured.
