Lion Tamer in Roumanian Metropolis Loses Consciousness While Beasts Are Perfectly Quiet, and Result is Almost a Panic

BUCHAREST, March 7.—Mlle. Tancasco, a lion tamer, caused great commotion amounting almost to a panic, in an audience at Iasi, by fainting in the midst of her performance while the animals were perfectly quiet. She was quickly removed before the beasts could attack her, and on recovering consciousness exclaimed: "If you don't take away that beetle crawling on one of the bars I'll not go in the den again."

### SALMON FLEET WILL SOON BE STARTED FOR SEASON

Final Overhauling of Alaska Fishers' Craft Which Wintered in the Columbia River Now on—Can Handle Nearly \$2,000,000 Catch.

PORTLAND, March 7.—Final overhauling of the Alaska salmon fleet that wintered in the Columbia River is under way, and in about three weeks the fleet will be on its way north for six months' work. The vessels will carry 1,200 men, and will have on board sufficient material to put up 360,000 cases of salmon, valued at \$1,600,000, and 300,000 worth of salted salmon.

### BLACK HAND IS OUSTED BY STRONG RUSSIAN FIST

Secret Organization Among Officers of Serbian Army, Opposed to Present Dynasty, Less Active From Fear of Czar's Mailed Digits

BELGRADE, Serbia, March 7.—Pressure brought to bear by Russia seems for the time being to have curbed the activity of the "Black Hand" secret organization among the officers of the Serbian army, which is opposed to the present dynasty. Fear is felt that Russia may lay her mailed fist upon the little kingdom in the event that another royal tragedy such as that nine years ago, when King Alexander and his wife, Draga, were brutally murdered, is re-entacted.

### CARICATURES OF IRISH CHARACTER ARE DEPICTED

Ancient Order of Hibernians Asks Souvenir Dealers Not to Sell Replicas of Michael Which More Resemble Hairy-Faced Simians.

PORTLAND, March 7.—"For the love of Mike, don't sell St. Patrick's Day souvenirs making light of the Irish race and face." This, in substance, is the request which the Ancient Order of Hibernians made to souvenir dealers here. Tired of having the Irish countenances caricatured to resemble a "hairy faced monkey," the local branch of the organization has decided to endeavor to put an end to the sale of "souvenirs" of such character.
