HOUSTON church. The bridegroom was a widower whose wife had committed suicide three months before.

After the funeral he was followed by a mob shouting "hypocrite," "murderer," and the angry townswomen snatched the widower's memorial wreath from the grave, replacing it with a placard reading: "No flowers for the dead from one who refused brend to the living."
