**FOUR DAYS FIGHTING;
FEDERALS RETREATING**
EL PASO, March 27.—After four days and nights of fighting, beginning at Macalon on Saturday, and ending at 9 o'clock last night on the outskirts of Jiminez the federals under command of Generals Aubert, Villa and Urbina are retreating. They stopped this morning ten miles from the San Pedro ranch exhausted. Both sides are resting, caring for the wounded, and burying the dead. Federals are reported as awaiting the arrival of General Blanquet with a thousand fresh troops. Renewed federal attack on Jiminez is planned this afternoon.
