

# CARROLL CASE BEING HEARD

**TRIAL OF MAN CHARGED WITH  
LARCENY BY BAILEE IS INTER-  
SPERSED WITH NEAR CLASHES  
BY ATTORNEYS**

The case of the State of Oregon vs. John D. Carroll, charged with larceny by bailee, was called for trial at 3:30 this afternoon in Judge Graves' court. The state was represented by Chas. J. Ferguson, and the defendant by Attorney C. M. Onell. Mr. Carroll entered a plea of not guilty.

M. P. Michler, the complaining witness, was called, and testified that Mr. Carroll as mortgagor of personal property sold him a buggy, harness, seeder, harrow, plow, scales, blacksmith outfit, etc., of a value of \$500, and that Mr. Carroll represented the property as free from encumbrances. The property was disturbed by a replevin suit by Martin Brothers on March 13th.

Several clashes occurred during hearing between the complaining witness and the attorney for the defendant. On one occasion Onell turned to the witness and said: "You close up and shut up." Mr. Ferguson intervened in a pacific way, and Mr. Onell retorted: "There are some things you have seen that you would not like to describe." The case was still in progress at press time.

The case had been set for trial at 2:30, but it was an hour later before the parties to the suit appeared in court. In the meantime the prosecuting forces with Carroll, the defendant, and the complaining witness were in the office of Noland & Crane, and it is believed that an attempt was being made to settle the case before it came to trial, but evidently no agreement was reached.
