WOULD SOLVE ROAD PROBLEM

WHAT is believed to be a most
meritorious plan, although
rather unusual, and bold stroke for
the financing of the good roads move-
ment in undeveloped districts of Ore-
gon, Washington and Idaho, was
made by the Progressive Business
Men's Club of Portland at a luncheon
this week, when a resolution was sub-
mitted proposing that the proceeds of
1,000,000 acres of government land
in the three states constitute a fund
for the building of highways.

The resolution requests this action
by congress and asks that develop-
ment and commercial organizations
of the three states get back of the
movement, the thought being that the
proceeds of land could not be spent
to better advantage than in building
roads through the land.

The resolution recites that "the
advantages and benefits derived from
the systematic making of permanent
roads is beyond question," that "the
development of any undeveloped area
is given impetus by the construction
of good roads and the values of lands
are increased and production quick-
ened."

Again, that "it is within the provi-
dence of the republican form of gov-
ernment under which we live to give
aid, encouragement and financial
help to the development of unsettled
lands held by the United States gov-
ernment," also that "the value of the
lands sold by the United States gov-
ernment is of small value until roads
are built, land is improved and pro-
duction and population established,"
and adds:


"Be it resolved that the Progress-
ive Business Men's club calls upon
the congress of the United States to
set aside as a road building fund the
proceeds of 1,000,000 acres of gov-
ernment land within the three states
of Oregon, Washington and Idaho,
said fund to be devoted, under fed-
eral supervision to the systematic con-
struction of permanent roads in such
undeveloped sections of the three
states as would otherwise be unable
to contribute funds necessary for such
road construction."

It was stated there was no legal
bar to such action provided the con-
gress formally approved the estab-
lishing of the fund.
