WAR AVIATION TRAINING TO BE RESUMED SOON

Large Number of Militia Officers From Nearly Every State in Union Expected to Report to Learn How to Handle Aeroplanes

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 1.—A large number of militia officers from nearly every state in the Union is expected to report at College Park, Md., aviation school, when experiments with the government's aeroplanes are resumed this month. War department officials are expecting great results from the aerial squadron, and elaborate preparations are being made at the "school."

It is probable that the war department will have three new officers ready for detail at the aviation school by April. Already the men have been selected, but as yet no word has been given by the department as to whether or not they would agree to become aviators. Unless an officer consents to take up aviation work the department will not compel him.

Harry Gammeter, of Cleveland, O., who is in San Diego, Calif., will resume his experiments with the "ornithopter" in the near future. Gammeter insists that too much power is being wasted in operating machines, and that the ornithopter will carry as much weight with nine or ten horsepower as other aeroplanes will with seventy-five.
