COMMERCE BODY WORKS TONIGHT

VIEWS OF SAN FRANCISCO TRIP TO BE SHOWN, BOX FACTORY MATTER TO BE CONSIDERED, ALSO NEW MEMBERS

Tonight at 7 o'clock at the Houston opera house the regular quarterly meeting of the Klamath Chamber of Commerce is to be held, and the call for the same has been issued by Secretary Caleb T. Oliver.

The occasion will be one of special interest by reason of the topics which are to be considered, as well as the fact that the views of the recent invasion of the Golden Gate city by the Klamath Falls and Portland boosters will be shown. They were run off last night to be sure they were in shape, and promises to be a revelation to those who have not witnessed them. The views demonstrate the importance of the position which the local uplifters held during the San Francisco junket and illustrate aptly the good time which was had by everybody. There are scenes of the choosing of the site for the Oregon building at the 1915 exposition, the big automobile parade, the Presidio exercises and the trip on the bay by steamer. Everything in the pictures is a demonstration of the hospitality of the Golden Gate city and the kindness shown the visitors on every hand.

One of the propositions which may be considered tonight is the Johnson-larke box factory. It is believed that all that is now necessary is for the site to be turned over to the factory on the showing that the promoters have made arrangements to carry out their part of the bargain. It is understood that W. S. Fish of the Chamber's directory and Robert A. Johnson of the box factory company have chosen a site satisfactory to both sides.

New members will be acted on at tonight's meeting, and the general public is urged to attend the gathering, which is in the nature of an open meeting and reception, more than a strictly business affair. The Chamber is a public institution, and as far as possible offers the public the benefit of its sessions.

TAVERN LICENSE NOT NOW DESIRED

PETITION OF THOMAS F. McLAUGHLIN FOR PERMIT TO SELL INTOXICANTS WITHDRAWN WITH NO EXPLANATION

When the time set for the hearing of the petition of Thomas F. McLaughlin for a liquor license at the Altamont Tavern arrived this morning, Judge Drake appeared before the county court and requested to be permitted to withdraw the petition, which was granted. No explanation was given. A remonstrance against the granting of the petition had been filed, and it is stated that a number of the names signed to the petition also appeared on the remonstrance, and with these deducted from the petition it would probably leave it without sufficient number of signers. The question as to the sufficiency of the petition is believed to have been the reason for withdrawal.

NEWELL REPLIES TO JUDGE WORDEN

From F. H. Newell, director of the United States Reclamation service, County Judge William S. Worden has received a letter in response to the judge's communication of March 18, asking information relative to the government furnishing water for the proposed Pine Grove irrigation district. Director Newell advises that the matters asked about have been taken under advisement, and as soon as they can be duly considered the judge will be further advised. What the farmers want to know is, whether the government will furnish them water from the reclamation service main canal, how much water can be had, and the cost of it.
