SUFFRAGE HYSTERIA HAS INSANITY FORMS

Eminent English Specialist in Mental Disorders Says School Mistress Enthusiasts Are Having Insidious Effect Via Pupils

LONDON, April 10.—"Insurgent hysteria" is Dr. Leonard Williams' answer to the question that has of late been sorely puzzling the British public, "Why is a Suffragette?"

The doctor, who is a distinguished specialist in mental disorders, in an interview declared that there was no form or pseudo-insanity that was not found in the suffrage movement. Incidentally, he calls attention to a phase of the subject which he believes has not been sufficiently recognized thus far. "The suffrage movement has a very large number of school mistresses among its warmest supporters," he declares. "The public does not seem to realize that the influence of these enthusiasts over their pupils is having a very insidious effect, of which the inevitable results are the spasmodic outbreaks against authority to which we are growing so accustomed. The doctrines of 'the vote' with all its clap-trap is the chief ingredient of the atmosphere in which these school girls live. They are being coaxed, drawn and even driven into the whirlwind of a movement of which illegitimate and lawless excitement is the essence, and in which credit is obtained only by screaming and scratching and wanton destruction."

"The mediocrity who esteems herself an unrecognized genius, the artistically uneducated who whimpers for the limelight so brutally withheld, the 'soul' who neglects her domestic duties to devote herself to the regeneration of a man-made world, are all types familiar in every consulting room. The real danger is not that these unlovely characters exist, but that they are now being manufactured in enormous numbers. Unless British parents wake up to the fact and make careful inquiry before selecting schools for their children, this insurgent hysteria will be the ruin of us."

FINNISH PILOTS QUIT BALTIC SEA SERVICE

So-Called Russification of Service by Czar's Representatives Strongly Opposed by Navigators, Who Find Working Conditions Trying

HELLINGFORS, Finland, April 10.—Preferring to starve rather than submit to the "Russification" of the pilotage service, 75 per cent of the Finnish pilots, who are considered indispensable to the navigation of the Baltic, have resigned. Threats and promises of higher pay have been employed by the Russian authorities, but with small success.
In one instance a Russian superin-

endent besought his men to remain in service by assuring them that under the new regime the punishment for theft would be exceedingly light. The pilots said this would be no inducement, as they were not in the habit of stealing.
