

ASKS FOR BIG CRUISER FOR NEXT ROSE FESTIVAL

Navy Secretary and Oregon Congressional Delegation Requested to Have the Maryland, Captain Elliott, Cross Aquatic Events.

PORTLAND, April 12.—Letters asking that the United States cruiser Maryland, Captain Elliott, be sent to Portland to grace aquatic events of the Rose Festival have been forwarded to the secretary of the navy and the Oregon senators and representatives at Washington by the officers of the Rose Festival association and the Chamber of Commerce.

Preparations are being made to entertain 300 delegates to the tri-state convention of presidential postmasters in Portland, June 11-14, during the Rose Festival. Dan D. Bush, the chairman of the committee on attendance for the Washington postmasters, has written to say that Washington will send a delegation of 100. Others are to come from Oregon and Idaho. Mrs. U. B. Hough, secretary of the Spokane Aster show, has sent notice to the Rose Festival that Spokane intends to outdo Portland in the matter of festivals this summer. Answer has been made that Portland welcomes the competition.

AMERICAN PRISONER IN HANDS OF MEXICANS

Civil Engineer of Southern California Writes to Friends That He Was Fleeing Toward Native Shore When Apprehended

LOS ANGELES, April 12.—Appealing to friends in Los Angeles, and requesting that his predicament be brought to the attention of United States Senator Works, C. A. Heberlein, a civil engineer of Los Angeles, has written from Mexico with news that he is a prisoner at Jimines.

Heberlein's letter states that he was fleeing toward the American border when arrested for no apparent reason, in spite of the fact that he carried a safe conduct card and offered adequate bonds. He claims the Mexican authorities at Jimines had refused to permit him to communicate with the American consul at Chihuahua.

ROMANCE IS REVEALED WHEN BOY IN BURIED

At Funeral of Marine Corps Member Young Woman in Mourning Appears Who Says She Was Engaged to Deceased

CENTRALIA, Wash., April 12.—A romance was unearthed at the funeral in Portland of Albert N. Bannister, the Centralia boy who was a member of the marine corps, and who was drowned in that city last Tuesday.

A young woman in mourning was noticed by Centralia relatives at the services and later at the cemetery. When "taps" had been sounded and the body of the young marine was lowered, the young woman was questioned. She refused to give her name but said that she had been engaged to be married to young Mr. Bannister. She said she was 17 years of age, and would fall heir to \$8,000 on her 18th birthday, on which date she and Mr. Bannister had planned to be married.

She left the cemetery hurriedly after talking to the relatives, and all efforts of Mrs. J. S. Roberts, the youth's mother, whose home is here, to find her proved unavailing.

Roosevelt Declares That Recent Avance in Illinois Is Pronouncement in Favor of Social and Industrial Justice

GREENSBURG, Pa., April 12.—Colonel Roosevelt sent a congratulatory telegram from here to Medill McCormick at Chicago. The message said in part:

"The outcome in Illinois is not a victory for me, but primarily a victory for the cause of social and industrial justice. The people of Illinois had a chance to speak for themselves. The result in Indiana, Michigan and Kentucky would have been practically the same if the chance of expression had been given the people."
