DOOR IS CHOPPED DOWN TO LET IN DELEGATES

Militia Who Had Been Guarding Against This Offer No Resistance After Police Battered their Way Through and Into Hall

CHICAGO, April 15.—County Judge Owen personally directed the police in chopping down the Seventh armory door so the democratic county convention could be held according to his order, as head of the Cook county election machinery.

Colonel Moriarty, commanding 150 militiamen, had defied the police and sheriff, and refused to open the doors for the convention under Judge McKinley's injunction. Three hundred police entered.

Soldiers standing at attention inside didn't resist. Republican Election Commissioner Antony C. Czarnecki prepared the call for the democratic convention order under Owen's protection.

FEDERAL FLOOD EXPENSE BEST PART OF MILLION

President Sends Special Message to Congress Asking Big Appropriation to Pay for Work Done and to Cover Future Needs

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 15.—President Taft has sent a special message to congress asking \$787,879 to meet expenses already incurred in the Mississippi flood and to pay expenses for future work.

THE CITY POLL BOOKS ARE NOT GETTING FULL

CHANCES SEEM TO BE THAT WHEN THEY WILL CLOSE AT 6 P. M. TODAY TOTAL WILL BE UNDER LAST YEAR

There is very little chance of the city registration this year reaching the mark set last year. When the books closed last year there were a few over 900 voters registered, and at 3 o'clock this afternoon only 532 names had been placed on the books. As the books close at 6 o'clock this evening it looks as if the registration will fall short of the 900 mark.

Many of the voters do not seem to realize that it is necessary to register twice, once for the county and once for the city elections. Those who have failed to register with the police judge before 6 o'clock tonight will be unable to vote at the coming special and city elections, as it is not possible for a voter to swear in his vote in, as is the case in county and state elections.
