Message Alleged to Have Been Sent to Operators Telling Them to "Hold Stories for Dollars"

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 23.—"Keep your mouths shut. Hold stories for dollars in four figures. Marconi agreeing. Will meet you at dock." This message is alleged to have been sent to all Marconi wireless operators by Chief Operator W. T. Sammis of the Marconi system in New York, resulting in the people of two continents being rocked with anxiety and grief concerning the fate of the passengers of the wrecked Titanic.

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**ROOSEVELT SHY VOTES IF CRAWFORD IS RIGHT**

Oregon Attorney General Eugene Nelson Has Majority of Primary Votes He Is Expected to First Republish

BALEM, April 22.—If Attorney General Crawford's interpretation of the proportional features of Oregon's election law is correct, Theodore Roosevelt's victory may be but half a victory after all.

According to his theory, proportional representation means that unless some one candidate in the race for the presidential nomination, which is the office affected by that provision, receives a majority of all the votes cast by the electors of his party for that office, he is entitled to the support of only such delegates as were pledged to him before the primary election. The other delegates should support the candidates for whom they were pledged.

In other words, according to this interpretation, unless one candidate receives a majority vote of his party, each delegate to the national convention is supposed to support the candidate of the faction of the party which elected such delegate.

Others point out that this interpretation is entirely at variance with the purpose of the proportional primary law, which, it is said, is intended to operate in instructing delegates in the same manner that Statement No. 1 instructs legislators in voting for a candidate for United States senator.
