**BUYS PROPERTY IN NEW PINE CREEK**

Nelson Rounsevell of Klamath Falls  
 Invests Heavily in Town Property  
 Near the New Mining Camp of  
 Highgrade

One of the most important realty  
 transactions that has occurred in the  
 New Pine Creek section since the gold  
 excitement began was closed this  
 week between Nelson Rounsevell of  
 Klamath Falls and Hall & Reynolds  
 of this city.

The deal, aggregating \$16,190, in-  
 cluded sixty-five acres lying at the  
 foot of Highgrade canyon. In addi-  
 tion the sale called for thirty-one  
 town lots adjoining the business sec-  
 tion of the town at the present time.  
 There were two houses on the prop-  
 erty, one being the new four-room  
 bungalow just completed by Dr. Hall.  
 The acreage will at once be sub-  
 divided into town lots, and it is be-  
 lieved that the location of it will  
 make it tremendously valuable if  
 there is a permanent camp estab-  
 lished in the Highgrade district.

Considering the close proximity of  
 the property to the town, the price  
 paid was not excessive, even at the  
 present property valuations, and it is  
 believed that the lots will be market-  
 ed at a price that will allow a wide  
 margin for speculation.—Lakeview
