BEGIN WORK ON WOOD RIVER CREAMERY SOON

(Special Herald Correspondence)
FORT KLAMATH, April 30.—The directors of the Wood River Valley Cream and Butter Association are having some difficulty in securing a site for their new creamery, but they hope to have a suitable location within a few days at the latest, when work will begin on the building.

A number more of artesian wells are being drilled in Fort Klamath this spring, and the owners are securing an excellent flow of the purest water. The entire valley is pretty well supplied with artesian wells, which are proving an absolute success. Frank Hartleg runs the well boring outfit now in operation, and guarantees the well at a cost of \$100. The supply of artesian water in the valley is of the very best and practically unlimited.

Short Brothers have moved their traction engine and hay baler out to Frank Denton's, where they have considerable hay to bale.

Utter & Burns are doing great work plowing with their big caterpillar engine. They are now plowing for James Pelton, and are breaking sod to a depth of from eight to ten inches. There is going to be considerable farming done in the valley this year. J. W. Cox is going to have 400 acres in wheat and oats, which will make, approximately, 1,000 acres in the valley this season, and every indication points to a bumper crop.

Utter & Burns are preparing to start up their saw mill, and will probably have it running full capacity by the fore part of the month.

The Adams dredge, which has been working on the dykes the past two years in reclaiming the Abner Weed swamp land, burned Sunday night at 5 o'clock. Everything was burned down to the deck, destroying all the machinery.

FRENCH AVIATOR FALLS SEVEN HUNDRED FEET

While Attempting to Create a New Record, and Flying One Hundred Miles an Hour, His Aeroplane Suddenly Collapses

PARIS, April 30.—Jules Vedrines, while endeavoring to create a new record from Douai to Madrid, and flying at nearly a hundred miles an hour, his aeroplane suddenly collapsed and he fell seven hundred feet. He was hurried to a hospital, where it was found he had a compound fracture of the skull at the base and top and also internal injuries. The physicians say he has a chance for recovery.

He lost the election by a very small margin, and at once contested the election, with good chances of still gaining his desires.
