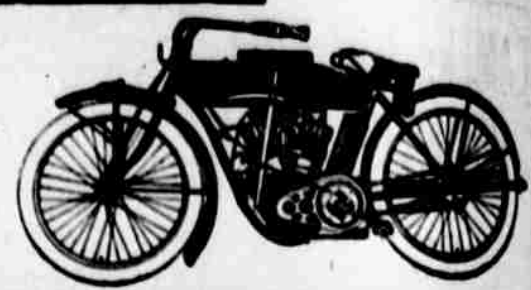

The public will please take notice that at 10 o'clock a. m., on Monday, the 24 day of June, 1913, or as soon thereafter as petitioner can be heard, the undersigned will apply to the county court and the county commissioners of the state of Oregon for Klamath county, in the court room of said court in the county court house at Klamath Falls, Oregon, for a liquor license, licensing him to sell, exchange or otherwise dispose of spirituous, malt or vinous liquors, or fermented cider, commonly known as "hard cider," in quantities of less than one gallon, for a period of one year from the date said license may be granted, in Mills Addition Precinct, county of Klamath, state of Oregon; said liquors to be disposed of in the building known as the "Altamont Tavern," the same being situated in the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of section 2, township 39 south, range 9 east, Willamette meridian, in Klamath county, Oregon.

We, the undersigned, being an actual majority of the whole number of legal voters in Mills Addition Precinct, in Klamath county, state of Oregon, hereby respectfully petition the honorable county court of Klamath county, state of Oregon, that liquor license be granted to T. A. Jackson, to sell, exchange or otherwise dispose of spirituous, malt or vinous liquors or fermented cider, commonly known as "hard cider," in quantities of less than one gallon, in Mills Addition Precinct, in Klamath county, state of Oregon.
And we, the undersigned, hereby certify that there is no college or university located within a distance of one mile from the said Mills Addition Precinct, in Klamath county, and state of Oregon, and that there is no school erected or maintained by the Government of the United States of America, within two miles of the said Mills Addition Precinct, in Klamath county, state of Oregon.
And we, the undersigned, hereby certify that we are legal voters, and have been actual residents of said Mills Addition Precinct, in Klamath county, state of Oregon, for more than thirty days immediately preceding the date of signing this petition, and that we are legal voters in Klamath county, state of Oregon.
And we, the undersigned, hereby further respectfully petition that said license be granted to said T. A. Jackson, for a period of one year from and after the date of the granting of said license.
