**WANTS REPRESENTATION BASED ON POPULATION**

The People's Power League Frames a Measure to Make a Change in the Legislature—Abolishes Senate and Confines House to Sixty Members

PORTLAND, May 20.—Representation in the legislature based on the population as shown by the 1910 census is proposed by the People's Power League. This idea is incorporated in the measure to be submitted to the voters of the state in November. Apportionment heretofore has been made arbitrarily, and by this arrangement Multnomah county, containing one-fourth of the population of the state, never has had all the members to which it was entitled. Under the proposed measure Multnomah would not have as many members as at present, but based on the population the representation would be more accurate. The plan abolishes the state senate, and keeps the house of representatives with sixty members. This is the way the representatives are apportioned:

Instead of electing representatives every two years, the measure provides that representatives be elected for a term of four years. The compensation is \$3 a day and \$3 for every twenty miles traveled going to and from the sessions.

An honored practice, that of dodging roll call when a member does not want to go on record for or against a bill receives a body blow in the proposed measure. Every time a member fails to vote on roll call \$10 is deducted from his salary, unless excused by a ye and nay vote of a majority of all the members.

**NEW CRATER LAKE ROUTE IS URGED**

Citizens of Myrtle Creek, Oregon, Inform the Governor That Route Via That Enterprising City Is Shortest and Easiest Way to Famed Wonder

MYRTLE CREEK, May 20.—At the commencement exercises of the Myrtle Creek high school last week, Governor West delivered the address to the graduating class.

At the close of the commencement exercises Myrtle Creek Commercial Club entertained the governor with a short program, the principal feature of which was the presentation of a diploma by S. S. Johns. The governor had previously told the students with a note of regret that he had never received a diploma, having been forced to leave school at an early age in order to earn a living. The one given him consisted of a map of the Myrtle Creek route to Crater Lake by way of the South Umpqua River.

By this proposed route for the Pacific highway some eighty miles is cut off the distance to Crater Lake as compared with the route by way of Grants Pass and Medford, and three or four mountain divides are eliminated. From Myrtle Creek to the point on Rogue River, where the two routes leading to the lake converge, the distance by the new route is thirty-five miles, while by the way of Grants Pass and Medford it is 115 miles.

The governor was also presented with a golden key, on which was inscribed words stating that Myrtle Creek was the key to the northern gateway to Crater Lake. At the close of the club's program a feature of which was a talk from the governor on his prison policy, and a promise that he was going to go over the proposed route to Crater Lake at some convenient date, the crowd adjourned to a downstairs room, where an informal reception and strawberry and cream feed was held.

**CALIFORNIA MAY HAVE TO CHANGE STATE SEAL**

Would Replace Emblem of Grizzly Bear, Which Is Nearly Extinct, With a Milking Pail or a Veal Calf to Accompany Minerva

SACRAMENTO, May 20.—It won't be long before California will have to add a milking pail to the collection of emblems upon her state seal, or a veal calf, rampant, to take the place of the nearly extinct grizzly bear which keeps Minerva company. This is the testimony of the state dairy bureau, by F. W. Andreasen, its secretary.

He shows that there are today half a million dairy cows on the hillsides of California, and that last year about \$23,250,000 was divided among 20,000 families and farms producing milk and cream from these cows.

For the past fifteen years, he says, there has been an increase of from 4 to 16 per cent a year in the dairy business in California.

**COMMERCE COURT DENIES INJUNCTION TO ESPEE**

C., May 20.—It is announced that Judge Carland of the commerce court has denied the preliminary injunction which the Southern Pacific sought against the latest commerce commission decision in the litigation resulting from the pre-cooling and price-fixing which the California citrus fruit growers started. The decision saves the California growers and shippers \$800,000 annually.
