**PINCHOT PLANS FOR
TIMBER CONVERSATION**

British Columbia Has Secured the
Services of Former Timber Experts
At Washington for the Protection
of Canada's Forests

VICTORIA, B. C., May 25.—British
Columbia is to have a system of
forest protection conservation, and
the minister of lands will, in the
course of a few days, accept an out-
line of a system which Mr. Clifford
Pinchot, the premier conservationist
of the United States during the ad-
ministration of President Roosevelt,
is now preparing.
Some time ago the Canadian gov-
ernment engaged W. O. Price, who
was Mr. Pinchot's assistant at the
head of the forest service, to make a
study of British Columbia's valuable
forest tracts, their better protection
from fires and general conservation.
Mr. Price's work is nearly completed,
and he called in to go over the scheme
with Mr. Pinchot, who has just arrived
in Vancouver.
"This important work," said Mr.
Pinchot, "was never before thor-
oughly organized in British Columbia,
yet her timber, I believe, is one of her
most valuable assets. Forest fires
make the greatest menace and hard-
est work before the conservationists."

LAWS GOOD, SAYS WEST**

SALEM, May 25.—Inquiries con-
tinued to come to the governor's office
asking why a fraternal insurance man
was not named upon the recently ap-
pointed commission to revise the in-
surance laws of the state. In ex-
planation Governor West said:
"There was recently passed by this
state a fraternal insurance measure,
which was recommended by the Na-
tional Fraternal Congress, and which
seems to cover the ground so far as
fraternal insurance is concerned,
pretty well. It was felt that the mat-
ter of fraternal insurance should not
be taken up at this time, and for this
reason no representative of fraternal
insurance was appointed upon the
commission."
