## FALLEN RULER'S END IS NOT FAR DISTANT

It is Thought That the Baby Emperor of China is Sure to Meet Death by Violence—The First Attempt Failed

PEKIN, June 22.—Nobody has yet been arrested for the attempt made fully a month ago, to assassinate the baby emperor of China, and so far as any appearance of police activity is concerned, it does not look as if the authorities have ever tried to find the culprit. This indifference on the part of the new government is being generally attributed today to a belief among its leaders that the deposed ruler will be a menace to the republic as long as he lives.  
In a country so large, so poorly supplied with means of communication and in so confused a state as China, it is not surprising that the would-be assassin should be hard to

find after once getting safely away from the Chang Chun palace, through a window of which he fled at the little ex-ruler, playing inside. But it is difficult to understand how he managed to approach so close to the palace or to escape after his attempt, without the collusion of the numerous guards which swarm that neighborhood.

The popular judgment now is that the circumstances of the recent attempt to bear out the accuracy of the forecast made when the baby emperor was allowed to retain his title at the time of the Manchu abdication. At this time it was predicted that an emperor in a republic was too much of a paradox to last, and that the little ex-monarch's death by violence is a matter of only a few months at most, though poison is looked on as a much likelier means of eliminating him than the bullet.

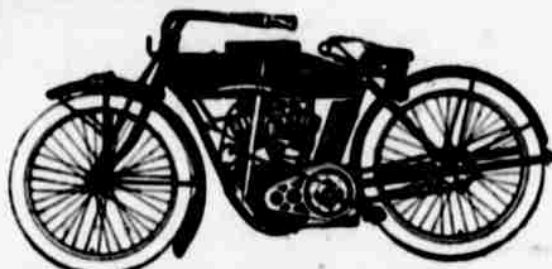
