TAXPAYERS OPPOSE "BLUE SKY" BILL

SALEM, June 29.—The third party sentiment permeated Marion county politics when the Marion County Taxpayers League, with fifteen representatives here, met and named an independent county ticket. The league also went on record as opposed to the "Blue Sky" bill, claiming that it will create a new commission which will mean the expenditure of \$25,000 the first year and \$20,000 each year thereafter.

The action of the taxpayers league of Marion county in opposing the "Blue Sky" bill is commendable from an economical standpoint, to say the least. Initiative petitions proposing the bill are now being circulated in Klamath county, and voters should carefully consider the measure before signing the petition.
