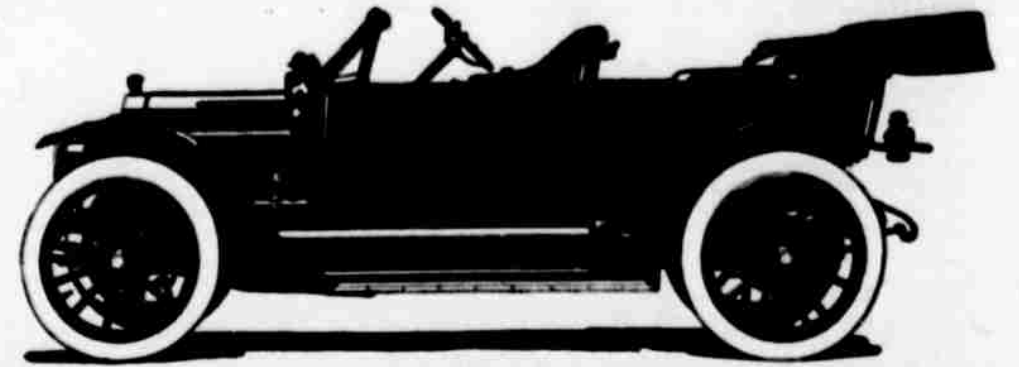

MEXICAN REBELS

ARE DISARMED

ANGRY AT THEIR FAILURE TO GET PAY HUNDREDS DESERT AND CROSS TO THE AMERICAN SIDE OF BORDER

EL PASO, Texas, July 8.—One thousand rebel soldiers have been disarmed in Juarez because of drunken riots. The rebels are angry at their failure to get their pay, and hundreds have deserted and went to the American side. The main body of rebels are resting at Chihuahua.

Under General Huerta, two brigades of federal cavalry are rushing northward in an attempt to engage the forces of General Orozco.

On his retreat Orozco destroyed all the bridges.
