city. He stated that he had not given the matter sufficient thought to offer any suggestions along that line, but he was strongly in favor of an extra effort to secure connection with the California highway.

"What you want in this town is an organization that is really and truly representative of all the interests of the city," said S. O. Johnson. He went on to tell of the experiences in San Francisco, where they had five or six different organizations, all working along different lines, without any apparent results and a lot of energy expended until they got together and formed one of the best working organizations on the coast. Mr. Johnson referred to the excellent work being done on the roads of the county, but he said one of the most important roads in the county was being neglected. The road to Shippington, between the city and its manufacturing section, was in deplorable condition. At the conclusion of his speech, in which he urged the consolidation of the two commercial organizations into one body, Judge Benson appointed the following committee, consisting of three members of the Chamber of Commerce and three from the Klamath Commercial Club, to look after the entertainment of the visitors and report on the matter of a consolidation: Charles Graves, P. L. Fountain, Hiram F. Murdoch, W. A. Delzel, S. B. Evans and E. R. Reames.

Among the other speakers were S. T. Summers, C. T. Oliver, W. O. Smith, Mayor T. F. Nicholas, A. L. Leavitt, W. A. Delzel, S. B. Evans, Alex Martin, Sr., and L. S. Boucher, a recent arrival from South Dakota. "We have a great state," said Mr. Boucher, "and we have good roads, but we have not some of the things that you have here. I think you are going to have a greater Salt Lake City. You have everything they have and I think you have more."

W. P. Johnson asked permission to say one word more. He stated that on Tuesday next C. C. Chapman with the Pathfinder party would be in the city, it would be necessary to begin at once preparing for their entertainment. He expected to go to Crater Lake to meet the party, and asked permission to appoint the following committee to have charge of the arrangements for the entertainment: W. O. Smith, J. F. Maguire and F. D. Miles.
