## PLAN PRESERVES FOR WILD GAME

NATIONAL SECRETARY OF AUDUBON SOCIETIES COMES TO OREGON TO ASSIST IN BIRD AND ANIMAL PROTECTION

PORTLAND, Aug. 1.—Mr. T. Gilbert Pearson, secretary of the National Association of Audubon Societies, has just arrived in Portland, coming direct from New York city. The object of his visit is to assist in the work of the Oregon Audubon Society, and the state board of fish and game commissioners in securing wider interest in bird and animal protection. Mr. Pearson is a writer of ability. His book, "Stories of Bird Life," has had wide circulation, especially in school work. He is also president of the National Association of Game Wardens and Commissioners, which meets in Denver August 30th.

"Song and insectivorous birds, as well as game birds and animals of Oregon must be provided with special refuges and retreats where they cannot be pursued and killed," said Mr. Pearson. "There are plenty of lakes, shore lines, rough mountain regions and other waste places that are of no use for agriculture where these creatures will thrive and increase if protected. The Audubon Society is investigating and seeking out these places with the idea of getting them stocked with birds that will protect our fields and forests from the ravages of insect pests."

"Oregon is fortunate in already having four of the largest and best wild bird reservations in the United States," continued Mr. Pearson. "Under the fish and game commission other refuges on private lands are being established in various parts of the state. It is very urgent that two or three large reserves be created for the protection of mountain sheep, elk, antelope and mule deer, which are rapidly approaching the point of final disappearance in this state."

date of any party since political conventions began.

"I accept the nomination you tender me with profound gratitude to the republican party that has thus twice honored me," replied the president in part. "I accept the nomination as the approval of the party of what I have done under its mandate, as an expression of confidence, that, in a second administration, I will serve the public well."

Rollers Are Discussed  
The president then, without mentioning names, discussed the bolt of the Rooseveltites and their plans for a reform government, declaring that "in the ultimate analysis, I fear that the plans of those who proclaim the coming of the so-called social justice involves a forced division of property. That means socialism."

"I feel uneasy concerning two gentlemen who now lead, one the democratic party and the other the republicans who have left the party in an attack on existing conditions, in an attempt to satisfy popular unrest by the promise of remedies. I fear that these men are consciously embarking upon socialism. The truth of the matter is, they do not offer definite legislation whereby the happy conditions they promise may be brought about, but if their promises mean anything they lead directly toward the appropriation of that which belongs to one man to give to another."

Hits Teddy's Policies  
"But after we have changed all of the governmental machinery so as to permit an instantaneous expression by the people of constitutional amendments, and have put into the statutes the recall of public agents, what then? Votes are not bread. Constitutional amendments are not work. Referendums don't pay rent or furnish houses. Recalls do not furnish clothing. Initiatives do not supply employment nor relieve the inequalities of condition or opportunity. We still ought to have before us definite plans to bring on complete equality in opportunity, and abolish hardships and evil for humanity. We listen to them in vain."
