"Day before yesterday he came to my house and he says:

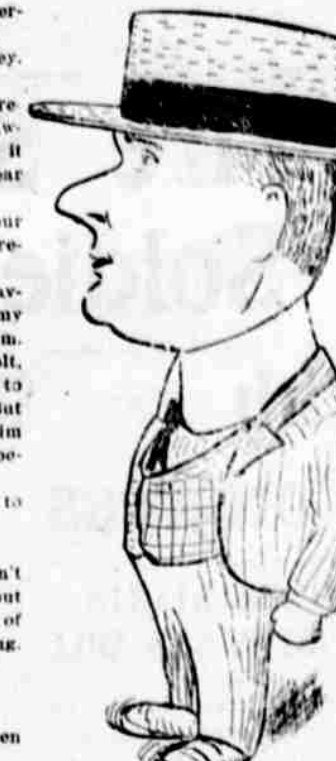
"Here's yer money."
