WHAT IS CIRCULATION?

SO IT appears that the Northwestern has 166 weekly subscribers, who take the paper on Fridays, and Mr. Evans counts these in as part of his bona fide circulation to the daily paper. Wonder how many other alleged subscribers he has who only receive the paper on certain other days of the week? And yet he boasts of his sworn circulation. A bona fide subscriber to a daily paper who receives it and pays for it one day out of the week might count as legitimate circulation with Mr. Evans, but it is not so considered by reputable newspapers.
 Mr. Evans wants to know why the editor of The Herald does not institute perjury proceedings against the editor of the Northwestern. One reason is that Mr. Evans does not swear to anything in his affidavit. It is a mere clerical error, but not so much so as to deceive the public. There is no perjury in swearing that one intends to do so and so. Mr. Evans swears that "the number of papers to be printed" on a certain date is 1300. He doesn't swear that he printed that many. Also these papers are to be "distributed to bona fide subscribers" of the Klamath Falls Northwestern, a daily paper.
 The Northwestern might have only 100 bona fide subscribers, and Mr. Evans might distribute 3,000 papers to these 100 subscribers, and there would be no perjury in the affidavit, worded as it is.
 The public is not interested in the number of papers the Northwestern prints, but they might like to know how many actual bona fide subscribers to the paper Mr. Evans has on his books. Be honest with the people, Mr. Evans, since you are in the affidavit business, and make a sworn affidavit that is honest and means something.

PROGRESSIVE CELESTIAL TURNS THINGS AROUND TO FIT HIS SURROUNDINGS, AND IS MAKING A SUCCESS OF VENTURE

 SOOCHOW, China, Aug. 10.—Ling Chu Ho has opened a chop suey restaurant in Soochow, and seems likely to get rich out of it.
 Ling is a merchant who visited the United States recently. While there he tasted chop suey for the first time, and it immediately struck him that his countrymen would like it. So he engaged a San Francisco cook skilled in its preparation, and brought him along when he returned to China.
 Just as the Chinese restaurants in the United States are fitted up to look as Chinese as possible, even so Ling's chop suey restaurant in Soochow is fitted in as distinctly American style as Ling could remember how to fit it. The chop suey, hitherto unknown in China, is advertised as the American national dish. It has made an immense hit, especially in view of the fact that Chinese "society" inclines to view visits to an American restaurant as a little bit "raque," and slumming parties of the most exclusive people in Soochow swarm in it nightly, gobbling chop suey and plumping themselves on their Bohemianism.

WOULD ADOPT STYLE OF DRESS

WUCHANG SOCIETY PETITIONS VICE PRESIDENT TO USE HIS INFLUENCE TOWARD MODERN STYLE OF APPAREL

 WUCHANG, China, Aug. 10.—The Wuchang Society for the Promotion of Home Industries has petitioned Vice President Li Yuan Hung to use his influence towards getting a new style of dress adopted throughout China.
 Evidently, the society's officers say, there is going to be a big change in Chinese styles. China is bound to be modernized, now that a republic has been established, and the present styles are distinctly old fashioned. But what are the new styles going to be like? It is important to know, the society points out, because so long as the present uncertainty continues, Chinese manufacturers have no idea what sort of wearing apparel to make, and in the meantime foreigners are getting the cream of the business.
 For instance, it is represented, the port of Tientsin alone has imported clothing and hats from Japan this spring to the value of 1,250,000 taels, or about \$85,000 gold. Wuchang will have to lay out \$500,000 on straw hats before the summer is over. It is estimated that altogether China will need \$5,000,000 taels, or about \$325,000,000 in foreign clothes this year, which the Chinese themselves could just as well have kept for themselves if they had only known in time that there was going to be such a demand for Occidental wearing apparel.
 Vice President Li does not seem to think that it is part of a government's business to settle questions of this kind. He has taken the matter up seriously with President Yuan Shi Kai, and promises to give an answer at the earliest possible moment.

PESKY ANTS TO BE "SWATTED"

STATE INSTITUTION SENDS OUT INFORMATION CONCERNING ERADICATION OF PESTS—POLYMER THE REMEDY

 CORVALLIS, Aug. 10.—The best methods of ridding lawns and houses of ants, which frequently become troublesome pests, are described by the crop pest workers of the Oregon Agricultural college, thus:
 "Whenever the ants' nest can be located the best means of destruction is to make a hole in the center of it with a crowbar or similar instrument, pour into it one or two ounces of bisulphide of carbon, tamp the soil back into the hole and throw a heavy blanket over the nest to hold in the fumes of the bisulphide.
 "To destroy ants in the house a mixture of three grains of tartar emetic and four ounces of syrup should be smeared over bits of china or chips and placed in the ants' runways. It is especially good as a remedy, because it will not kill the ants immediately. They carry the mixture to their nest and feed the larvae upon it, and thus kill out the entire colony."
