MAGNIFICENT BOOK IS ON THE SHELVES

John H. Williams has issued an Artistic Volume Entitled "The Guardians of the Columbia."—Profusely Illustrated

A year or two ago John H. Williams, the Tacoma author and publisher, celebrated the wonders of Mt. Tacoma (Rainier) in a splendidly illustrated book called "The Mountain That Was God." Although published at a low price, it was pronounced by experts to be the most beautiful book issued in any country about a great mountain. No other book of its class has ever won so great and immediate a success. More than 45,000 copies have already been sold.

Mr. Williams has followed this unique and taking volume with an equally artistic book of uniform style, entitled "The Guardians of the Columbia," which promises to be even more popular. It describes and pictures the Columbia River and its snow-capped sentinels, Mounts Hood, Adams and St. Helens. The history and legends of the great Cascade-Columbia region are told in graphic fashion that makes physical geography read like a story, but at the same time presents scientific facts with strict accuracy. Such a book has long been needed, and it will be welcomed as much for the value and interest of its text as for the magnificence of its illustrations.

KLAMATH MAN TELLS OF GROWTH OF CITY

Paul C. Paulson Cannot See Why This City
Should Not Enjoy Substantial Growth
For Many Months to Come

Paul C. Paulson of this city is one of those who cannot help but believe that this city is about to enjoy an era of prosperity, as the following indicates:

"It takes no great gift of prophecy to foretell that Klamath Falls will continue growing in population and prosperity faster than any other city or town in Southern Oregon," he writes.

"In its course of development of agriculture and horticulture the Klamath country is different from those agricultural sections which reach their zenith of prosperity in a few years time, and then begin to decline because they have nothing more to develop.

"The Klamath country will not reach its zenith of development so quick—but will continue in a steady growth for a long time to come. Its agricultural outputs will increase year by year, and so, also, will its lumber and manufacturing.

"The reason for this is natural. It takes time to clear off and prepare in proper shape for irrigation all the land which is so located that it can be put under irrigation, and to drain off the 100,000 or more acres of marsh land which eventually will also be put under tillage. All this will be accomplished gradually, and while it is going on it will help facili-
