ROAD TO SOLOMON FLATS IS FINISHED

Benefit to the City by the Completion of the Highway Will be Great. Residents Tell of Advantages of Road

Work on the new county road through Solomon Flats has been completed by the crew employed by the county under D. E. Burrell, and the improvement, according to testimony offered to the county court Saturday has already benefited local merchants to the extent of probably \$10,000 in trade. The further from the city the improvement is completed the greater the annual increase in benefits to local merchants is expected to be, and at the same time the outsiders who wish to do their marketing in this city are getting the advantage in doing their trading either nearer their homes, or in person, with the added factor of cheaper service.

Among the local tradesmen who spoke to the county court of the advantages accruing to them from good roads were Arthur C. Lewis of the Farmers' Implement and Supply company; Van Riper Bros., Ed Evans, Charles Martin of Martin Bros. Will Hurn and Fred Houston of the triple-K Store.

The redemption of the Solomon Flats road makes a way through one of the worst drains in this neighborhood, for the dirt gets practically all the moisture which settles in the Hog Creek country. The most admired piece of the road work, as well as the most important for such a small piece, is the 2,600 feet on the section line which passes the post indicating a 17-mile distance from Klamath Falls.

Here a little over 15,000 yards of dirt has been put in to make a road of ample width for teams, the thoroughfare being 30 feet wide at the base. The soil used to surface the road contains considerable pumice and makes a hard, smooth, durable top for the highway, good for any kind of travel.

Heretofore, from the latter part of September until the following June the road would be from one-quarter to three-quarters in the water, while in freezing winter weather it was all ice. The new one is built at right angles, and one of the features of it that Mr. Burrell admires most is that there is plenty of water stations along the new route, so that man and beast need not go dry.

A short distance this side of the Solomon Flats fill there is a well, while at the corner where the turn is made to reach that stretch there is a spring. Just beyond it there is a creek. At the 21-mile post there is a spring, also at 24 miles. At 25 miles there is more water, and at Kellogg, 28 1/2 miles, aqua may be had. Not far beyond is the river, and on either side of Long Prairie are watering places, while there are two in Long Prairie itself. At Bear Flats more water is found, and there is grass all the way, so that plenty of fodder is to be secured.

APPLE TREE LOW WITH BIG FRUIT

SPECIMEN ON HANDEMAN PROPERTY HAS TO BE PROPPED UP TO KEEP IT FROM BREAKING UNDER ITS HEAVY BURDEN

As an illustration of how well fruit is doing in this neighborhood, a tree on the Handerson property at Tenth and Pine streets is noted.

It is an apple tree, of comparatively modest size, but is loaded so heavily with fruit that it has had to be braced to keep its deeply bowed branches from breaking with their burden.

The apples are of good size and color, and all appear to be sound. The indications are that the tree will bear an exceptionally good crop when the fruit is ripe enough to be taken from it.

Apple Show Planned
WATSONVILLE, Aug. 19.—Preparations for the Third California Apple Show, which is to be held at Watsonville from October 7 to 13, are well under way here. The show this year will cover 90,000 square feet.
