NEW JUDGE SAID TO BE CORPORATE MAN

 SEATTLE, Aug. 21.—Clinton W. Howard, appointed by President Taft to succeed Federal Judge Hanford of Seattle, is the leading corporate attorney in Bellingham. He is counsel for the Great Northern Railroad company, the Stone-Webster Traction company, the Bellingham Bay Improvement company and other corporations. He was one of the character witnesses who testified in favor of Judge Hanford in the recent impeachment hearing by the congressional committee in Seattle. Howard was also president of the State Bar Association a year ago. In his work for the corporations Howard has not only been their leading counsel in courts, but has also been their chief lobbyist before the legislature and the city council of Bellingham.

William J. Biggar of Bellingham, candidate for congress on the progressive party ticket, this morning wired to Senator Poindexter of this state to the effect that Howard's appointment is an "outrageous insult" to the people, and that it ought not to be confirmed by the senate under any circumstances.

"Howard has always opposed the will of the people. He has always sought special privileges," said Biggar.

Seattle progressives are equally aroused. Plans are now being discussed to arrange for a monster protest meeting against the confirmation of Howard's appointment by the senate.

BOOKLET TELLS ABOUT OREGON

PLENTY OF ROOM HERE FOR SETTLEMENT, IS WRITER'S OPINION—COMPARES SECTION TO THE FAR EAST

Oregon, the state that can support twenty-nine additional persons for every six of its present population, is told of in a new way in a bright booklet written and copyrighted by Arthur I. Street, author of the "Pandex." His booklet is entitled "29 to 6 in Oregon," and in it he says:

"So far as having population in it is concerned, so far as having people to fill it up, Oregon is just as much behind the United States as a whole as 21 is behind 90. She's got that far to travel before her population average is up to the national average. She's got to get people in that much thicker. Got to get enough of them to plant them 21 instead of 90 acres apart. Got to increase her neighborliness with herself that much. Got to get that many more people on the automobile bus, as it were, and distribute them around."

Mr. Street says the number of people Oregon ought to have to be of the same "density" as the United States is 2,987,999, and that this in contrast with the census population of 673,745.

He has found that the population in a decade has increased nearly 100 per cent in Oregon. He predicts that Oregon's population in eight more years will have passed the million mark, and in ten years after that the population will be almost 2,000,000.

The booklet is addressed to the people of the West, who ought to have advantage of the room to develop and make fortunes that Oregon offers. Though written in a way that leaves none of the resources and attractions of Oregon undescribed, no over-statements are made.
