VACANCY CAUSE OF
MIX IN LEGAL CIRCLE

President Taft may be forced to
send the name of someone to the sen-
ate at once to fill the vacancy in the
United States marshal's office of Ore-
gon, since it was discovered that all
business being conducted by the office
now is invalid, and may result in
serious legal tangles. It was the in-
tention of the president, it is as-
serted, to wait until congress adjourned
to appoint a successor to Leslie M.
Scott, resigned, so that the senate
would not have a chance to block any
move made by holding up the confir-
mation.
The discovery that the office is vac-
ant was made by accident. Mr. Scott
was not notified that his resigna-
tion was accepted to take immedi-
ate effect, and his deputies have con-
tinued to transact all the business of
the United States courts. Chief Deputy
W. S. McSwain telegraphed to the
department of justice, signing
Mr. Scott's name as marshal, and was
notified at once by the department

that the office of marshal here was
vacant, as Mr. Scott's resignation had
been accepted by the president, August
10, taking effect then.
All processes served and all money
transactions made by the office since
then are probably illegal, but as only
routine business was transacted,
Judge Bean does not expect any seri-
ous legal complications. Four of the
deputies, however, find themselves
without jobs and with small chance
of drawing any pay for work done
since the 10th. They are H. M. Dukes,
W. B. Griffin, J. B. Marvin and R. F.
Beatty. They are personal appointees
of Mr. Scott. Chief Deputy McSwain
and Leonard Becker are under civil
service, but were commissioned by
Marshal Scott, and they may find
themselves in the same predicament.
Judge Bean telegraphed the de-
partment of justice asking instruc-
tions. In the meantime the court is
appointing special process servers for
all business that comes up, thus
avoiding any further complications.

A Glance at the Sporting Dope
"Chief" Bonner, pitcher, who was
playing in the Northwestern League
when he was drafted for the Phila-
delphia team of the American League,
with which he failed to make good, is
reported to have been signed for San
Francisco by Manager William Reidy.
Although he could not hold up on the
Philadelphia team, Manager Connie
Mack kept a string on him. Bon-
ner is said to be on his way to San
Francisco.
It is estimated that between \$2-
000,000 and \$3,000,000 was spent by
the 15 different nations which were
represented at the Olympic meet at
Stockholm this summer. England
spent more money than the American
athletes, for it had 300 athletes at
the games, which is a greater number
than those who made the trip from
America.
It is rumored that Ad Wolgast in-
tends to buy a stock ranch out in
this neck of the woods and settle
down after his fighting days are over.
Ad may conclude to do this sooner
than he anticipates if he meets Packy
McFarland in September.

In his own story of the winning of
the world's high jumping champion-
ship at Stockholm, told to friends on
his return, Alma W. Richards de-
clared that his victory over Horine
was not due to Horine's "form."
"In America," he said, "a slim
cane pole is used for a bar, and when
Horine jumps he bends the bar down,
but so skillfully that it does not fall
from the pegs.
"At the Olympic games they use a
stick an inch and a half thick, and
held by very short pegs, so that the
slightest touch knocks it off, requir-
ing an absolutely clean jump. Horine
was not accustomed to doing this, and
he fell down in his work.
"In the case of Liche, the German's
defeat was due to lack of courage.
Liche is the greatest high jumper in
the world, and if he had had some
American blood in him he would have
won."
