RAILROAD STARTS FILLING IN STRAIT

Commencement of filling the Klamath strait where the Southern Pacific crosses it has been begun by the railroad company, which work has given rise to reports that the company was overstepping its rights. The fact that the start was made on Sunday, possibly to avoid injunction proceedings by objectors, lent color to this report.

It was learned that the railroad office this morning that the railroad is fully within its rights in its action, and that some such undertaking had been anticipated from the first.

"When the railroad put in its temporary structure for crossing the strait it was understood later it would be replaced by a permanent embankment or some other form of crossing," said W. W. Patch, project engineer. "The bridge has been getting shaky, and the company has had to run its trains slowly across it, making extensive repairs necessary. The company could not be expected to leave the straits open in the old fashion, with the danger of wreck to its trains, for mere accommodation. The closing of the strait will no doubt be the cause of some inconvenience to the biological survey, which recently purchased a boat to make trips in its work, as well as to launch and fishing parties which have been accustomed to going through the straits to the Lower Lake.
