STREET WORK HAS RECLAIMED LAND

Already the improvement to Second street by the committee which is raising funds to make a boulevard there has accomplished what is asserted to be almost equivalent in value to what the work already done has cost.

All the property east of Second street and north of Willow street has been reclaimed and is declared to be ready for the plow as soon as the tules are burned off.

"This is due to the fill along Second street which has kept that territory from getting any fresh supply of water," said Secretary Caleb T. Oliver, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, who made an inspection of the territory concerned.

"It's all dried up there now, and as soon as the tules are out of the way the ground can be used. Anybody that has not paid any attention to that Second street improvement ought to go and take a look at it. I went down there with G. W. White, and I certainly was surprised at what I saw. It's simply great."

The committee which has been raising the money consists of G. W. White, Fred Melhase, president of the American Bank and Trust company; J. W. Stomess, president of the First Trust and Savings bank, and Alexander Martin, Sr., president of the First National bank.

WILL EMBARK IN NEW VENTURE

ENTERPRISING MERCHANT SEES GOOD CHANCE TO INCREASE MIN BANK ROLL, AND ACTS ACCORDINGLY
