## U. S. REPORT SAYS CROPS ARE GOOD

The Reclamation Service Record has the following to say about the Klamath project:  
Weather conditions were favorable and the crops, particularly grain and potatoes, promise large yields. The demand for water increased each week and 12,000 acre-feet were diverted through the main canal during the month. The first crop of hay was light, owing to the cool spring.  
The second unit lateral construction was established at Olene on the 1st, and work was at once started on the extension of the east branch canal and on the Olene crossing. Two large piers of the main span of this flume, together with several of the smaller trestle footings, were completed. Framing this structure was begun and a bridge across the east branch was completed.  
Water was discharged through the Lost River diversion channel the first week of the month, after which the reservoir was drawn down to permit the foundation work at Olene to proceed. This gave an opportunity to inspect the Lost River dam, and make some repairs.

## GAME WARDEN MAKES ARREST

**GRAND CHANCELLOR OF THE KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS ADMITTED THAT HE HAD MUTILATED CARCASS OF FEMALE DEER**  
ROSEBURG, Aug. 29.—Mutilating the carcass of a female deer he had killed in order to disguise the sex was an act to which a plea of guilty was entered in the justice court here by Frank T. Wrightman, ex-sheriff of Marion county. He paid the minimum fine of \$50.  
Wrightman was camped near Cow Creek canyon, south of this city, with a party of friends, one of whom was the present sheriff of Marion county, Harry Minto. As he was on his way to camp with the carcass of the doe Wrightman was intercepted by Deputy Game Warden F. B. Herrington of Grants Pass, whose curiosity resulted in Wrightman's arrest on the spot.  
Wrightman is the present grand chancellor of the Knights of Pythias of Oregon, and was for a number of years chief clerk of the corporation department at Salem, under the late Secretary of State Frank Benson of this city.
