DUNBAR SPEAKS OF SCHOOL IDEAS

CITY SUPERINTENDENT IS IN FAVOR OF GIVING SHIPPING-TON PUPILS BENEFIT OF NEW COURSE OF STUDY

Just what arrangement of grades for the new school building which has been constructed between Ship-pington and the Pelican Bay mill will be made has not been determined, according to City Superintendent of Schools Rosell H. Dunbar. Two teachers will be assigned there and six grades, possibly eight, will be taught.

"I am very anxious that some arrangement be made to bring down the seventh and eighth grade pupils, so that they may get the benefit of the manual training and domestic science courses in the high school," said Superintendent Dunbar, "but it remains to be seen what will be done in this respect. Last year we brought all pupils down, and figured on having a new building for the coming term. The site taken was a compromise one, and we thought the bonds for a building would be issued. But when it came to a vote the bond proposition was voted down and the result was the building which has been erected."

"The new building is 30x50, built in bungalow style, with a very nice hall, and generally fitted up and finished very neatly and comfortably. We have also on the Central school grounds put up a building costing about \$300 for the overflow of first grade pupils. It was cheaper to do this than to rent a building, for in the Mills addition we have rented a building for two years at \$700 per year, which makes \$2,400. If we had rented a building in the city we would have had to have a commodious one, which would probably have cost us more in rent than the annex that has been built. It has the use of the commodious Central school yard and other conveniences and a desirable location."
