LAKE COUNTY IS BEING CLEANED

Governor West's order to the vari-
ous sheriffs throughout the state to
eliminate slot machines has resulted
in closing up that line of industry in
Lakeview and other parts of Lake
county.

The illegal sale of liquor in a dry
precinct was stopped when a large
party of the Central Oregon Develop-
ment League members took a side
trip to New Pine Creek. Sheriff War-
ner Snyder, together with Deputies
Rinehart and Arthur, went to the
various places that are run as near-
beer joints and called for various
drinks that are generally served over
the bars in ordinary saloons. They

had no trouble being served with
what they called for and arrested ev-
ery proprietor in that vicinity. As
they pleaded guilty when brought be-
fore Justice Farrell, the county is
richer by about \$500.

New Pine Creek is one of the two
dry precincts left in Lake county, and
the residents there have petitioned
the county court, asking that they be
allowed to incorporate, when they
will in all probability vote the pre-
cinct wet, as it is tributary to the new
mining field in the High Grade dis-
trict, and the feeling there is against
having the first mining camp ever
known to be dry.

CANDIDATES RIDE ON WATER WAGON

PROHIBITION SPEAKERS WILL
BE IN KLAMATH FALLS TUES-
DAY—MAKING TOUR IN UNIQUE
AUTOMOBILE

B. Lee Padgett of Portland, candi-
date for United States senator on the
prohibition ticket, and O. A. Stillman,
candidate for congress, who will
speak in Klamath Falls on Tuesday
are employing an original means in
carrying on their campaign. They
are traveling by automobile through
the various counties of the state, and
their "water wagon," as their auto-
mobile has been called, has become
widely known in the districts where
they have visited.

Since their campaign opened, Aug-
ust 4th, they have spoken in 95
towns in Washington, Yamhill,
Clackamas, Marion, Polk, Benton,
Linn, Lane, Douglas and Josephine
counties.

In addition to the various towns
Mosses, Padgett and Stillman have
spoken to men in lumber camps, mills
and threshing crews in the fields.
They have received a thoughtful hear-
ing everywhere.

Mr. Padgett is a well known business
man of Portland. He has been treas-
urer of the People's Power League,
the organization which initiated the
various measures embraced in what
is known as the "Oregon system."

Its president is Benn Selling, repub-
lican senatorial candidate, and its
secretary is W. L. U'Ren, father of
the initiative and referendum. Mr.
Padgett is also a member of the state
grange.

Mr. Stillman is a well known min-
ister of Salem, where he has been
active in various civic reforms, and
is regarded as able, practical and pro-
gressive.
