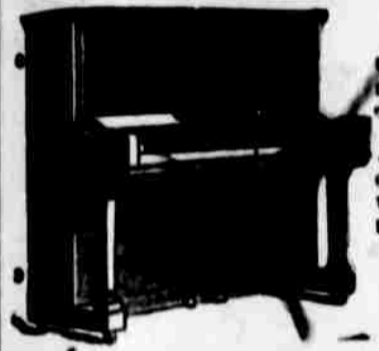

RECENT RAINS AID IN FIRE FIGHTING

One of the good results of the recent rains has been the elimination of any danger of a serious forest fire this year, according to C. S. Chapman, secretary of the Oregon Forest Fire association.

"Patrols have been mostly withdrawn, only a few men, who will be engaged in assisting to burn slashings and who will be on hand should a long spell of dry weather follow the rains, remaining on duty," said Mr. Chapman in an interview.

"The season has been an extremely fortunate one for Oregon timber owners. Better patrols than ever before in the history of the state, combined with frequent rains, have kept the loss of timber down to a small figure.

"Early in the spring plans for extensive patrols were put in effect, and timber owners and the state were ready to meet a bad fire season with all previous preparation possible. The weather conditions, however, aided in such a way that costs could be kept down to a minimum.

"In spite of the absence of serious conditions interest on the part of the public in protection work has been

greater than at any previous time. Few cases of carelessness on the part of campers, railroads or ranchers have been reported.

"A large amount of trail and telephone line building has been done, which will make it possible to start another season with means of communication in excellent shape.

"It is the consensus of opinion that the active interest of the state and of counties has to a marked degree stimulated and caused systematizing of fire protection work. The fire law passed by the last legislature has proven an excellent piece of legislation, and one which will each year save thousands of dollars' worth of property.

"The important work now is to get all possible slashings, which by spring will constitute a menace to adjacent timber, cleared up. Those having slashings to burn should watch their opportunity to burn, and then with the help of fire wardens eliminate these danger places. Even at this time, however, care must be exercised in burning slashings if damage is to be prevented.

POLES HAULED WATER ROUTE

RECLAMATION SERVICE USES MAIN IRRIGATION CANAL FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF TELEPHONE SUPPLIES

In four rafts, 670 telephone poles have been supplied by the reclamation service to the lower end of the main irrigation canal, a distance of about seven miles. These poles will be used for constructing the telephone lines for government use to the north and south laterals of the Poe Valley extension. The last of the rafts was delivered at its destination Tuesday afternoon.

The canal makes a convenient means of transportation for the government in much of the irrigation work, and the shipment of material by floating it down the big ditch as it is needed has saved the government a good many dollars in transportation charges.

LOCAL GARDENER MAKES GOOD SHOWING IN RAISING SWEET CORN ON A PATCH OF GROUND WITHIN CITY LIMITS

In less than two weeks time H. Newham has produced from his single acre and a half garden in this city and sold in the local market over 700 dozen ears of corn.

Mr. Newham showed the figures to a Herald man this morning, and the profit from this patch of ground would look well in most anyone's bank account.

For some time Mr. Newham has experimented in gardening in the vicinity of this city, and is now operating two or three different places, all within the city limits.
On last Monday Mr. Newham sent to market 171 dozen ears of the choicest corn yet sold in the local field. The corn is well filled out, tender and sweet, and there has been in Mr. Newham's experience here no damage resulting from frost.
