RATE FOR WATER IS NOT DEFINITELY SET

In an interview with the officials of the reclamation service it is learned that the statement that a charge of \$1.50 per acre for water to be furnished to pumping plants is not correct. No permanent charge for such service has been fixed, and the mistake arose from the fact that the service is furnishing a few small tracts near Merrill with water from present canals by gravity flow at that figure.

These tracts are not within the limits of the first unit, and the charge is fixed each year and only for a year at a time. Such charges are fixed by the local officers, but a permanent arrangement can only be made by the secretary of the interior.

This matter is covered by a law approved February 21, 1911, known as the Warren act. In part it reads as follows:

"That whenever * * * storage or carrying capacity has been or may be provided in excess of the requirements * * * under any project, the secretary of the interior is hereby authorized upon such terms as he may determine to be just and equitable, may contract for * * * such excess capacity with irrigation * * * systems and individuals, corporations, associations and irrigation districts * * * for the purpose of distribution to individual water users."

"In fixing the charges under any such contract * * * the secretary shall take into consideration the cost of construction and maintenance of the reservoir * * * and the canal by which such water is carried and such charges shall be just and equi-

table as to the water users under the government project."

The act also provides that the water shall be used under the same regulations as those governing government projects; that the charge to individuals shall be only enough above that paid by the government to cover cost of carriage and delivery, and that water cannot be furnished to more than 160 acres for one individual.

The project engineer, W. W. Patch, says that whenever a petition for water for pumping purposes shall be presented to him, he will promptly forward it through the proper channels to the secretary of the interior for decision under the above act.

From this it will be seen that if the people who own lands in this county which can be supplied by pumping, desire to secure water, all that is necessary for them to do is to form some kind of organization, get up a petition to the secretary of the interior, showing how much land each subscribed expects to irrigate, where the water is to be taken from and about what charge it is proposed to make to the individuals per acre.

When this is presented to the project engineer he will forward it to the department through the usual channels.

As the act shows, the secretary of the interior must take into consideration the interests of the water users in the regular project, who are paying for the cost of building the canals and for operating and maintaining them. The people who get water on a rental basis do not have to pay the building cost of \$30 per acre, but that cost must be taken into account in fixing the charge for rental, under the law.
