## NOTED WRITER TO VISIT HERE

MRS. E. L. SOUTH IS EXPECTED TO VISIT THIS CITY AND CRATER LAKE SOON—HER FATHER IS KNOWN HERE

It is quite possible that one of the visitors to Klamath Falls and Crater Lake very shortly will be Mrs. E. L. South, a well known Kentucky poet and teacher, whose father and the father of Captain O. C. Applegate of this city were cousins. If Mrs. South should come she will probably be accompanied from her home in Kentucky by her youngest son. Mrs. South is the author of several well known works of poetry as well as a translation from the German, on Martin Luther.

Accomplishment in letters seems to be widespread in the family, for Mrs. South's brother, Nicholas Vachal Lindsay, is rapidly advancing to the front in the ranks of American poets, one of his latest writings being "The Grave of the Proud Farmer," which appeared in the American Magazine, and was later repeated in the Literary Digest. It is regarded as one of the most powerful, rugged and meaningful poems, depicting a strong feature of strictly national life, that has appeared in United States literature in many years.

## NARROW MARGIN WOULD BE LEFT

FIGURES ON CANAL COST IN IRRIGATION PLAN NOT OBTAINABLE, BUT ASSUMED BASIS OF TWO-THIRDS FIGURES CLOSE

In the matter of the cost of irrigation water as furnished by the reclamation service, referred to in The Herald Thursday, an endeavor was made by The Herald to secure from the local office a statement as to the cost of canals as distinguished from the laterals, in order to make an estimate of what the difference might be. This the reclamation officials did not care to furnish.

However, on the assumption that the total cost would be \$20 and the canal cost \$20, estimating the charge of interest at 6 per cent, then the interest on the investment of \$20 would be \$1.20 per acre per annum. If the total charge should be fixed at \$1.50 per acre, this would leave but 30 cents per acre for operation and maintenance of the 40 miles of canals and flumes used in carrying water to the Sand Hollow district.

SACRAMENTO, Sept. 12.—War on the "bloated" profits of California railroads is promised here by the state railroad commission, which has appointed a corps of engineers to make a physical valuation of railroad property. John F. Hehnelman, president of the commission, insists that prevailing rates are "way out of proportion with the amount of money invested, and if his suspicions prove true, the commission intends to order sweeping reductions in freight and passenger rates.

## CAMP STOOLS WILL REPLACE MAHOGONY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.—Camp stools instead of mahogany easy chairs may be the official seats in the next congress for forty-odd new members of the house. Capitol attaches have discovered that there is no room on the house floor for more seats for the new members, when the house membership is increased from 393 to 435 members March 4th under the recent reapportionment.  
That it is impossible to provide desk room on the floor for the new members is declared. Superintendent Elliott Woods of the capitol building force is struggling with the problem, which promises to cause a torrent of criticism from newly-elected members.  
At present the floor space of the house chamber is jammed with desks built solidly together. Rearrangement of the whole floor and aisles is necessary to provide space for the extra members. Because of the late adjournment of congress last month, Superintendent Woods says it is a physical impossibility to re-arrange the desks of the house chamber before congress re-convenes, December 3d. It will be in continuous session thereafter until March 4th. Then it is probable that an extra session will be immediately called, when the new members will assume office.  
But some of the old members may be left to the "campstool" section, as seats are drawn by lot by all representatives alike.

## INDIAN RELICS ARE FOUND BY CALMES

Tom Calmes, the Merrill contractor, who has been making use of the material of Cinder mountains to bed the streets of Merrill and some of the roads near by, has, while excavating the material, run across what is believed to be an old burying ground of the Modoc Indians prior to Captain Jack's reign as a battle chieftain.  
Among the things unearthed were Indian skulls, which crumbled shortly after being exposed to the outer air, pipes in which the braves had evidently smoked for peace or something not as restful, arrowheads and bones. The pipes and some of the other discoveries were in a good state of preservation. Years ago some bear tusks as large as walrus tusks were found there.  
Mr. Calmes owns the mountain, which is on the island in Tule Lake. On the rocky cliffs of the island are some Indian hieroglyphics which have stood the winds and rains of a generation and are still in a good state of preservation.  
The island is at the end of a peninsula which leads from the main land, and during the time of the Modoc disturbances the soldiers of Uncle Sam's army made it a prison ground by putting on it captured braves and preventing their escape by guarding the peninsula approach.
