EUGENE, Sept. 21.—Fifty-one candidates for the University of Oregon football team were out for practice on Kincaid field this afternoon. Ten of the veterans of last year's varsity squad are numbered among those who attended practice, or who are expected to be back in college soon. The men with varsity experience are Dean Walker (captain) of Independence, Carl Benton of Dallas, Robert Bradshaw of The Dalles, Ed Bailey of Eugene, Joe Jones of Portland, "Bill" Heuser of Portland, Ben Chandler of Marshfield, Elmer Hall of Baker, Bob Fariss of Eugene and Alva Grout of Marshfield.

With a staff of three alumni coaches, the graduate coach system is being installed this year at the University of Oregon. Louis Pinkham of the class of 1911, is head coach, and Gordon Moores, '07, and Bill Main, '12, last year's captain, are his assistants. As all of the men are serving more from loyalty to their Alma Mater than from mercenary motives, it is felt that the inauguration of the graduate coach system is a step toward making college sport free of the taint of professionalism which adheres to the system under which the coaches are paid large sums to come from the East.

 HAVE ARMORY**

CITY COUNCIL GIVES \$2,000 OF THE \$5,000 REQUIRED AND THE WORK ON THE STRUCTURE IS TO START AT ONCE

ASHLAND, Sept. 21.—The Ashland city council late yesterday appropriated \$2,000, the city's proportion of the \$5,000 needed in excess of previous appropriations for the proposed Ashland armory. A telegram was received from Adjutant General Finzer, stating that the contract would be let and work on the armory commenced immediately upon receipt of a telegram of appropriation. This will make the entire cost of the armory and site about \$35,000. It will be located at the corner of Oak and B streets, within two blocks of the pass and in the heart of the city.
