HITS LIKE A FIRM

THE Northwestern is still keeping
up its reputation for being a
joke. The way it falls for every bait
that is placed is truly laughable. Wit-
ness its big "scoop" of this morning.
The petition of W. O. Smith for
citizenship has been filed and posted
in public for over three weeks, but
the efficient news gatherers of the
morning paper just discovered it yester-
day, and forthwith the paper pro-
ceeded to make itself ridiculous with-
out making any attempt at securing
the facts in the case.

We are sorry to disappoint the
Northwestern, but are forced to an-
nounce that W. O. Smith has been a
citizen of the United States, through
the naturalization of his father, for
the past twenty-eight years, and has
voted at every election for fifteen
years, since he became of age. In ad-
dition, he is the only candidate for
the state legislature, and there will
be no others. He will also qualify
for office when elected.

We might explain that the object
of securing citizenship papers is
simply a matter of personal con-
venience, so as to obviate the neces-
sity of continually securing certified
copies to prove citizenship. It is
much more convenient to have the
records of the circuit court of Klamath
county to resort to for proof.

One thing has been clearly shown
by the article this morning, and that
is animosity of a personal nature on
the part of the morning paper. The
Herald may differ with its contem-
poraries on public questions, but the
editor has never permitted this dif-
ference to influence or control mat-
ters of a personal nature between the
owners of the papers.

opposition for the office of state rep-
resentative, the article in the North-
western might have done harm, but
we cannot see the wisdom in their
action when they must know that the
time now is too short to permit any
other candidate getting a petition
signed and filed.

LAWS PROVIDE FOR FIRE PROTECTION

The attention of loggers and own-
ers of land on which logging is being
done is called to section 11 of the
Oregon forest fire law, which is as
follows:

"All persons, firms or corporations
engaged in logging or permitting log-
ging upon their lands, in the state,
shall each year burn their annual
slashing, by which is meant the tops
and inflammable refuse left after
lumbering, that may carry fire or
cause it to spread, at such a time and
in such a manner and with such pro-
vision of help as will confine the fire
to their own lands. * * * All
burning under the provision of this

section shall be in accordance with
the provisions of sections 7 and 8 of
this act. Refusal or neglect to com-
ply with the provisions of this sec-
tion shall be punished by a fine of
not less than one hundred dollars or
more than one thousand dollars for
each offense, provided that the state
forester, with the consent of the
board of forestry, may suspend the
restrictions of this section when and
where he deems public safety so per-
mits or requires."

The law distinctly makes the burn-
ing of slashings the duty of the own-
er or the persons in control of the
land upon which they are located.

GOVERNMENT IS TO HELP BUILD ROADS

According to correspondence be-
tween Governor West and the depart-
ment of the interior, the government
will aid in the construction and main-
tenance of roads in national forests
in this state.

The recommendation has been
made that more than \$4,000 of the
total of \$17,023 available for this
state be spent in Crater National
forest. Part of this, it is proposed to
use to provide a good road to the
huckleberry patch, near Odessa.

The recommendation concerning
Crater National Park follows:

1—Cook and Green wagon road, 2
miles in length, estimated cost \$600
per mile; available, \$1,021.31.

This road will extend from one
end of the present wagon road toward
the Blue Ledge mine to the Cook and
Green pass. The altitude of the pass
is 4,500 feet. There is a movement
on foot among the mines to put a
wagon road through on the south
side of the Skakyou range to the
Klamath River. If this were done it

would give access to the Klamath
River region and save nearly fifty
miles of travel between the Rogue
and Klamath rivers. The local com-
munities would be vastly benefited by
such a road.

2—Huckleberry gap to Woodruff
Meadows road, 6 miles, estimated
cost \$500 per mile; total, \$3,000.

There is not even a trail between
these two points at the present time.
There are no means of communica-
tion between these two points, and in
case of fire such as occurred two
years ago a road would be of vast
benefit, not only to the forest service
but to the public generally in the
saving of time in reaching a fire, and
more effectively insure protection of
the heavy stand of timber in this
part of the country. In addition, it
would benefit thousands of campers
and huckleberry pickers, and at the
Woodruff Meadows would connect
with a road extending out about two
miles to a connection with the present
Crater Lake road.
