OLCOTT TO HAVE SMALL DEFICIT

SECRETARY OF STATE FINDS HE
 IS UNABLE TO CONDUCT HIS
 OFFICE ON THE SUM ALLOWED
 BY LAW MAKERS

SALEM, Oct. 4.—With a deficit of
 about \$4,000 in his funds for inci-
 dentals, which he will have to report
 to the legislature, Secretary of State
 Ben W. Olcott has asked the state
 board to go on record in favor of a
 law which would relieve him of the
 responsibility of handling this fund.
 He offered a motion, which the board
 passed, to the effect that a law should
 be presented to the legislature pro-
 viding that each department should
 purchase all its own supplies.

Under the present law many of the
 departments of the state government
 are furnished their supplies by the
 secretary of state. An appropriation
 of \$28,000 was made by the last leg-
 islature for this purpose. The idea
 seemed to be that by having one
 source of supply for the incidental of-
 fice supplies of the various depart-
 ments a closer touch could be kept on
 the purchases and more economy
 would be practiced than to permit
 each department head freely to buy
 its own supplies.

But Secretary of State Olcott has
 been unable to hold the purchases
 within the appropriation, and for
 some time has been agitating the
 proposition of securing a law putting
 it up to each department to purchase
 its own supplies, and thus relieve
 his office of the responsibility.

The deficit in this fund will be one
 of the very few that will be reported
 by the present administration.

CHAMBERLAIN TELLS OF APPROPRIATIONS

PORTLAND, Oct. 4.—Throwing
 light upon the controversy between
 Congressman Lafferty and Thomas
 McCusker, candidate for the office of
 congressman, as to what portion of
 the Oregon appropriations made by
 the last session of congress for the
 fiscal year ended June 30, 1918,
 should be credited to the Oregon con-
 gressmen and what is due as a credit
 to the senators, an interesting state-
 ment has been secured. This state-
 ment was prepared by Senator Cham-
 berlain, not to illustrate this point,
 but as a record of the appropriation
 work the last session, and it was given
 out at the time of his return to the
 city, the present week.

The statement shows that of the
 \$2,848,622 appropriated for Oregon
 by congress at the last session, \$2,
 305,622 originated in the house,

CITIZENS OF LA PINE PLANT SOME FISH

LA PINE, Ore., Oct. 4.—The La
 Pine Commercial club, which has
 been interesting itself in stocking
 with rainbow trout East Lake, which
 lies in the Paulina mountains about
 fifteen miles east of La Pine, has just
 completed the planting of twenty-five
 ten-gallon cans of rainbow fry in that
 lake. This last planting is regarded
 as one of the most successful under-
 taken in the state, as only about 200
 out of the entire shipment were lost,
 although they were carried by team
 and pack animals over forty-seven
 miles after leaving the railroad at
 Bend.

Owing to the fact that East Lake
 has no visible outlet, it has been im-
 possible for fish to enter it. One of
 the deputy state fish commissioners
 who accompanied the first shipment
 planted by the commercial club here
 about the middle of July last, stated
 that it was an ideal lake for fish, and

RUSSIANS NOW HAVE PRESS MAN

IN ORDER TO MAKE THE GOV-
 ERNMENT POPULAR WITH THE
 MASSES, SERVICES OF AN EXP-
 ERT ARE SECURED

 TEHRAN, Oct. 4.—That the Rus-
 sian government has recently en-
 gaged the services of an up-to-date
 press agent for its army is strongly
 suspected from the character of an
 item appearing in a number of Per-
 sian newspapers.

 the colonel of the local Cossacks for

 trooper, in view of the regiment's
 forthcoming departure for Tabriz.

 girl's request, but complimented her
 patriotism.
